I. SYNOPSIS:

(Note: For the purposes of this report, the terms X-26, X-26 Taser, Taser, and Electronic Control Device (ECD) all refer to the X-26 Taser manufactured By Taser International in Scottsdale Arizona.)

On 05-27-2011, at approximately 0715 hours, Alberto Castillo and Xochilt Sandoval were involved in a domestic violence incident in the master bedroom of their residence located at 2917 Theresa Avenue. Also present in the bedroom at the time of the fight were their two minor children ages four and five. During the fight, Castillo accused Sandoval of seeing another man, and claimed the other man was on the roof. During the fight, Castillo punched Sandoval in the face, stabbing her in the hand with a screwdriver, tried to cut her fingers off with a pair of pliers, and threatening to kill her. Castillo's father Ines Castillo, and a family friend Jovita Lopez came to the aid of

Sandoval and witnessed the fight between Castillo and Sandoval. Lopez called 911 at Ines Castillo's direction.

At 0733 hours, Lopez's 911 call was received by the LVMPD and event number 110527-0950 was generated. At 0735 hours, the Domestic Violence incident was broadcast over the police radio indicating that the male subject, Alberto, was stabbing the female with a screwdriver, and that medical was en route. At 0737 hours Officers Thompson and Gastelum were assigned to the event, and at approximately 0738 hours Officer Corbett assigned himself to the incident. Also at approximately 0738 hours, the police dispatcher advised the responding officers that children were inside the house, and that the male (Alberto) was on drugs.

At approximately 0740 hours, Officers Thompson, Gastelum, and Corbett arrived at 2917 Theresa Avenue. As the officers approached the house they heard screaming coming from inside the house. The officers were met at the door by Ines Castillo who spoke to them in Spanish, and motioned them toward a hallway on the east side of the house. While the officers were in the house they heard more screaming coming from the bedrooms on the north side of the house. The Officers walked north in the hallway to a closed bedroom door where the screaming seemed to be coming from. The officers identified themselves, and Officer Thompson tried to open the bedroom door, but it was locked so he kicked the door open. When the officers entered the bedroom, they saw two small children on a bed in the northeast corner of the room, and Castillo and Sandoval on a bed along the north wall of the bedroom. Castillo had his left arm encircled around Sandoval's neck, and was holding a silver colored object to Sandoval's throat with his right hand. Officer Corbett ushered the two children out of the bedroom, as Officer Thompson and Officer Gastelum drew their pistols and ordered Castillo to show them his hands and release Sandoval. The officers issued their commands to Castillo in both English and Spanish. When Castillo refused to comply with their orders, Officer Gastelum holstered his pistol, drew his X-26 Taser, and fired it at Castillo. While Officer Gastelum discharged his Taser, Officer Corbett re-entered the room, grabbed Castillo's foot, and pulled him off the bed away from Sandoval. When Castillo was pulled onto the floor, he began kicking the officers causing Officer Corbett to release his grip on Castillo's foot.

Officer Thompson believed Officer Gastelum's Taser was not having an effect on Castillo, so he holstered his pistol and drew his Taser. While Castillo was still on the floor near the twin bed, Officer Thompson discharged his Taser striking Castillo with two darts in the torso. According to Officer Thompson, the Taser still did not seem to have an effect on Castillo, so he used his Taser to "touch stun" Castillo in the thigh. When Officer Thompson used the "touch stun" technique on Castillo, Castillo grabbed Officer Thompson's Taser with his right hand and kicked Officer Thompson backward causing him to lose his grip on his Taser at which point Castillo pulled it out of Officer Thompson's hand. As Officer Thompson fell backward and Castillo had control of his

Taser, Officer Thompson drew his Glock 17 9mm pistol and fired eight times at Castillo from a distance of approximately 5'10". All eight of Officer Thompson's shots struck Castillo.

After Castillo was shot, fire department paramedics arrived and determined Castillo was deceased. The paramedics also examined Sandoval's injuries and treated her at the scene.

On 05-28-11, Clark County Medical Examiner Dr. Gary Telgenhoff performed an autopsy on the body of Alberto Castillo. Dr. Telgenhoff determined that Castillo had been struck with three Taser darts in the upper torso. Dr. Telgenhoff also determined that Castillo had been shot eight times. Toxicological testing on Castillo was positive for methamphetamine.

V. INITIAL RESPONSE / FIT NOTIFICATION:

(Note: For the purposes of this report, the terms X-26, X-26 Taser, Taser, and Electronic Control Device (ECD) all refer to the X-26 Taser manufactured By Taser International in Scottsdale Arizona.)

Alberto Castillo, Xochilth Sandoval, their two minor children lived in Castillo's father Ines Castillo's residence at 2917 Theresa Avenue. Also present in the residence at the time on 05-27-2011 was Castillo's father Ines Castillo, and a family friend Jovita Lopez. Ines Castillo told detectives that his son Alberto frequently used methamphetamine, but that on 05-27-2011 Alberto's behavior was much worse than normal.

On 05-27-2011, at approximately 0715 hours, Alberto Castillo and Xochilt Sandoval were involved in a domestic violence incident in the master bedroom of their residence located at 2917 Theresa Avenue. Also present in the bedroom at the time of the fight were their two minor children ages four and five. During the fight, Castillo accused Sandoval of seeing another man, and claimed the other man was on the roof. During the fight, Castillo punched Sandoval in the face, stabbing her in the hand with a screwdriver, tried to cut her fingers off with a pair of pliers, and threatening to kill her. Castillo's father Ines Castillo, and a family friend Jovita Lopez came to the aid of Sandoval and witnessed the fight between Castillo and Sandoval. Lopez called 911 at Ines Castillo's direction.

Officer Thompson remained on lethal cover with his handgun drawn until he believed Officer Gastelum's Electronic Control Device (ECD) was not having any effect on Castillo at which time he holstered his pistol and drew his ECD. While Castillo was still on the floor on the south side of the twin bed, Officer Thompson discharged his ECD at Castillo striking him with two darts in the torso. As Castillo continued to resist Officer Thompson and Gastelum in the very confined area of the bedroom he grabbed Officer Gastelum's ECD with his left hand. When Castillo grabbed Officer Gastelum's ECD, Officer Thompson used his ECD to "touch stun" Castillo in the thigh. When Castillo was "touch stunned," Castillo grabbed Officer Thompson's ECD with his right hand, kicked Officer Thompson backward, and pulled the ECD from Officer Thompson's hand. While Officer Thompson was falling backward, he drew his Glock 17 9mm pistol and fired eight times at Castillo from a distance of approximately 5'10". Castillo was sitting on the floor with his back against a television which was lying on the floor behind him when he was shot. All eight of Officer Thompson's bullets struck Castillo in the torso.

At approximately 0746 hours, Officer Corbett advised the dispatcher that shots had been fired and requested medical. After Officer Corbett requested medical personnel, the dispatcher told him the fire department was holding short and would be in momentarily. Las Vegas Fire Department Paramedics examined Castillo and determined he was beyond resuscitation. The paramedics also examined Sandoval's injuries, and determined she did not need further medical treatment. After the scene was secured, patrol supervisors requested Homicide Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators respond to conduct the investigation.

At approximately 0800 hours, Sgt. Sanford from the Homicide Section Force Investigation Team (FIT) was notified of the shooting at 2917 Theresa Avenue. Sgt. Sanford notified the detectives assigned to the FIT team and directed they respond to

the scene. Upon arrival, Sgt. Sanford assigned Detectives Sanborn, Boucher, Kisner, and Embrey to interview the witnesses and countdown the involved officers' weapons. Sgt. Sanford assigned me to conduct the investigation of the crime scene.

VI. DESCRIPTION OF SCENE AND VISIBLE EVIDENCE:

A. DESCRIPTION OF THE SCENE

Vehicle DT 10071 (Officer Thompson's vehicle)

Officer Thompson's LVMPD patrol vehicle DT10071 was parked across the street from 2917 Theresa Avenue. I found the shotgun Officer Thompson took into the residence in the trunk of his vehicle. The shotgun was a Remington 870 pump action shotgun, which was loaded with one 00 buck cartridge in the chamber, and five 00 buck cartridges in the magazine tube. The shotgun had a side saddle shell carrier which was loaded to capacity with three tactical slug cartridges and three 00 buck cartridges. The shotgun had not been fired, so it was photographed by CSA Albert, but not impounded. For further details refer to CSA Spoor's Crime Scene Investigation Report.

2917 Theresa Avenue

The scene was located in master bedroom of 2917 Theresa Avenue. 2917 Theresa Avenue is a single family, single story residence located on the north side of Theresa Avenue in approximately the middle of the block. The front door of the residence had a mesh security door in front of it which opened outward. The front door opened into a living room, and a hallway lead from the living room to the bedrooms which were located on the east and north sides of the residence. The master bedroom was located on the north side of the house.

I found a Speer 9mm Luger cartridge lying on the sidewalk in front of the front door. The cartridge was picked up in tread of Fire Fighter Lawrence's boot while he was in the master bedroom and brought outside where he picked it out of the tread. I also found a gray X-26 Taser cartridge door lying on the front patio near the front door. The cartridge door was apparently carried out of the master bedroom on the bottom of an officer or fire fighter's shoe.

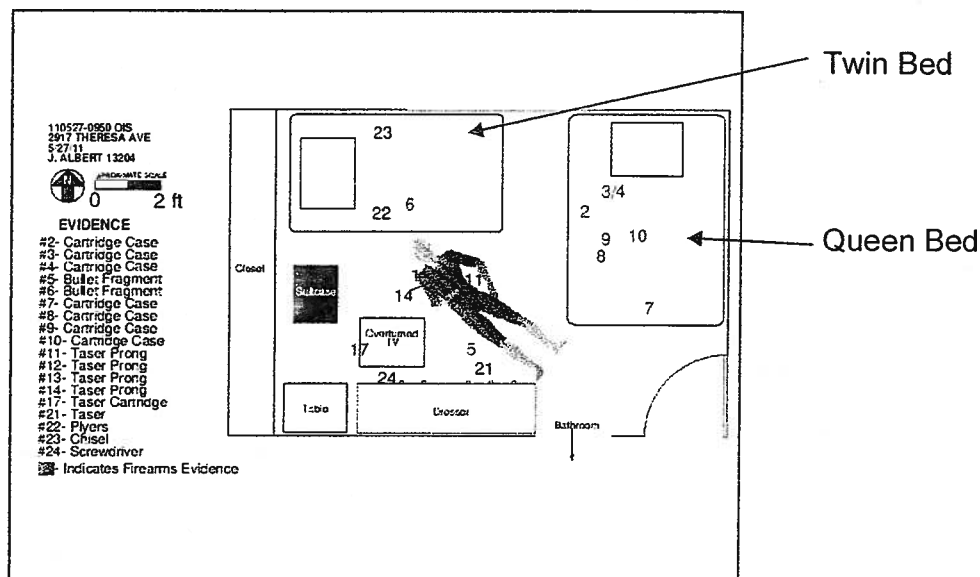
Prior to entering 2917 Theresa Avenue, I obtained written consent to search the house from Xochilt Sandoval, and Detective Boucher obtained written consent to search from Ines Castillo-Bartolo who is the owner of the house.

Master Bedroom

When I arrived, the bedroom door was open, the lights in the room were off, and the window was covered with a curtain. Even though the window was covered there was still enough ambient light to clearly make out small objects in the room. The exterior face of the bedroom door was cracked, and there was a shoe print near the door knob. The shoe print was attributed to Officer Thompson when he kicked the door open.

A queen size bed was located along the east wall, a twin bed was located in the northwest corner of the room, a small table with a refrigerator on top of it was located in the southwest corner of the room, and a dresser was located on the south wall. A closet was located on the west wall of the bedroom and two suitcases were lying on the carpet in front of the closet. The bathroom was located on the south side of the bedroom. A television and DVD player which had been sitting on top of the dresser was lying face down in front of the dresser when I arrived.

The queen bed which was located in the northeast corner of the bedroom is where the suspect's two children were sitting when the officers entered the bedroom. Several pillows were lying on top of the north side of the bed, one pillow was lying at the foot of the bed, and the bed was covered with a quilt. Lying on top of the bed were seven (7) 9mm Luger cartridge casings. The

location of the cartridge casings is consistent with Officer Thompson's recollection of firing his 9mm pistol from the area near the foot of the bed. Also located on top of the bed was a black rubber plug from a Taser Cartridge. The aforementioned items of evidence were collected by CSA Albert.

The suspect and Xochilt Sandoval were sitting on the west end of the twin bed when the officers entered the bedroom. There were several pillows near the west end of the bed, and one near the east end of the bed. A white cloth mattress cover was partially covering the west end of the bed, and a blue blanket was wadded up in front of the pillows on the west end of the bed. Located on top of the bed was a silver colored pair of pliers, a brick chisel with an approximately 4" blade, a fired bullet, and a "V-Tech" brand cordless telephone (last number dialed was). I found an apparent bloodstain on the mattress cover near the center of the bed, and a pair of blue jeans near the east end of the bed. Lying on the carpet on the south side of the bed was a black, Nike brand tennis shoe. The laces on the shoe were tied, and matched the shoe on the suspect's right foot. I also found a white blanket lying on the carpet on the south side of the bed. The blanket was bloodstained and was partially underneath the suspect's head. The chisel, pliers, and bullet fragment were collected as by CSA Albert.

I found several pink and yellow colored paper AFID tags on the beds, the carpet between the beds, and scattered about the carpet. The tags are used in the X-26 (ECD) Taser cartridges to distinguish which cartridge was fired. Each tag is marked with the serial number of the cartridge it is associated with. The two serial numbers associated with the tags found in the master bedroom were T06-1090398 and T08-2059117. Cartridge T06 was fired by Officer Gastelum, and cartridge T08 was fired by Officer Thompson. Cartridge T06-1090398 still had one lead wire attached to it, and was lying on the carpet in front of the closet on the west side of the bedroom. Cartridge T08-2059117 was still installed in Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser.

Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser, Serial Number X00-056564, was lying on the carpet between the suspect's right leg and the front of the dresser. The Taser was still in the "fire" position when I entered the bedroom, so I switched it to the "safe" position.

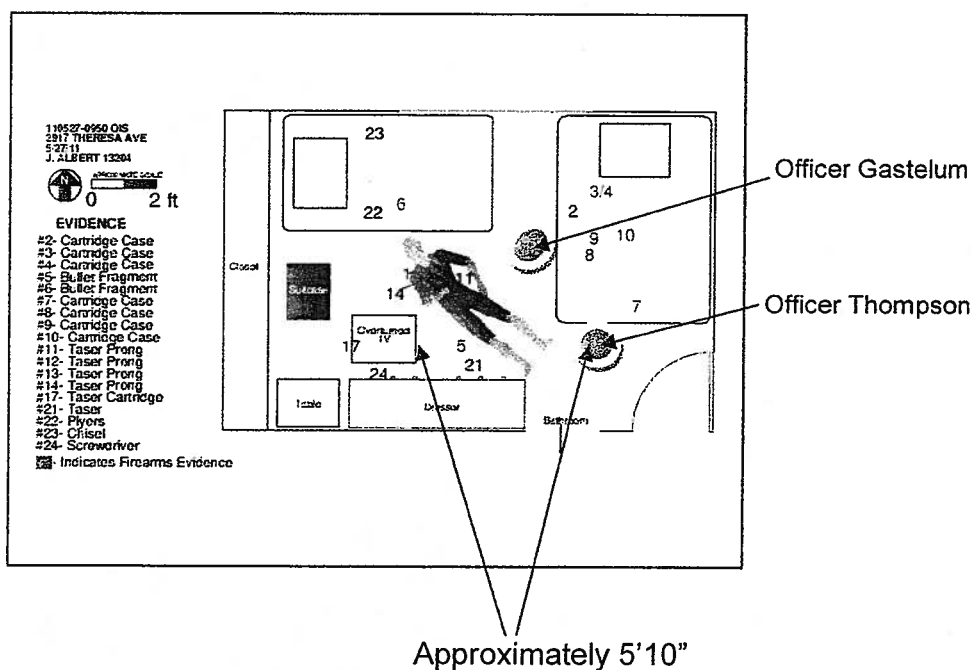
In addition to the X-26 Taser cartridges and AFIDs, I also found two sets of X-26 Taser cartridge wires, one cartridge door, and four (4) ECD darts. One dart was located on the carpet next to the suspect's left hip, one was embedded in the suspect's right shoulder, one was embedded in the right side of the suspect's torso, and one dart was located on the carpet under the suspect's left hip. All of the aforementioned X-26 Taser components including Officer Thompson's Taser

which contained cartridge T08-2059117 were impounded as evidence by CSA Albert.

The other evidence I found lying on the floor in the bedroom included a "Stanley" brand flat tip screwdriver which was lying on the carpet between the television and the front of the dresser, a fired bullet which was lying next to the suspect's right hip, and a tweezer and nail clipper which was lying on the right side of the suspect. I also found a Bud Lite beer can lying on the carpet near the television. The screwdriver and fired bullet were collected as evidence by CSA Albert.

Trajectories and Distances



Based on the location of the AFID tags from Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser, it appears he was standing on the west side of the queen bed when he fired his Taser at the suspect who was sitting on the twin bed. Based on the AFID tags from Officer Thompson's Taser, it appears that he was standing in the area between the twin bed and the dresser when he fired his ECD in the direction of the suspect who was on the floor south of the twin bed. Based on the location of Officer Thompson's 9mm cartridge casings, it appears he was approximately 5'10" east of the suspect on the south side of the queen bed when he fired at the suspect. At the time the suspect was shot, he was sitting on the floor with his back against the overturned television.

Scene Clean-up

After the crime scene processing was completed and the suspect's body was removed, H2O cleaners arrived and cleaned up the blood in the master bedroom.

B. LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION OF THE BODY

(Note: For the purposes of this report, the terms X-26, X-26 Taser, Taser, and Electronic Control Device (ECD) all refer to the X-26 Taser manufactured By Taser International in Scottsdale Arizona.)

The suspect was lying supine on the carpet in front of the dresser with his head pointed toward the northwest and his feet pointed toward the southeast. The suspect's right shoulder was resting on the corner of the television, his right foot was near the northeast edge of the dresser, and his left foot was near the south side of the queen bed. The suspect's feet were approximately 3' northwest of the bedroom door. Both of the suspect's legs were straight, his left arm was lying long his left side, and his right arm was bent at the elbow with his hand behind his back.

The suspect was dressed in a blue T-shirt, blue jean shorts with a black belt, one white athletic sock on his right foot, and a white athletic sock and a black Nike tennis shoe on his left foot. The suspect's T-shirt and blue jeans were bloodstained, and there were several apparent bullet defects in the front of the shirt. As I examined the suspect, I saw two Taser darts embedded in the suspect's T-shirt. One dart was embedded in the right shoulder, and one was embedded on the right side of the suspect's torso. Both darts were removed by CSAs with permission of Inv. J. Demers from the Coroner's Office.

Inv. Demers examined the suspect's body and found numerous apparent gunshot wounds on his torso. After examining the suspect's body, Inv. Demers pronounced death at 1340 hours. During Inv. Demers' examination, she found a Nevada Drivers License in the suspect's right front pocket. The license was in the name of Alberto Castillo. After Inv. Demers completed her examination, the suspect's hands were bagged to preserve any evidence, then the suspect was placed in a body bag and transported to the Coroner's Office by Valley Funeral Home.

Based on video from Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser, the suspect was originally lying with his back against the television, and was later moved to a supine position by fire department paramedics.

C. INJURIES TO XOCHILT SANDOVAL

After I arrived at the scene, I met with Xochilt Sandoval to obtain consent to search her residence at 2917 Theresa Avenue, and to view the injuries inflicted on her by Alberto Castillo. Sandoval had an abrasion on the fifth finger of her right hand, and plier rib marks on her right thumb. Her left index finger was swollen and I saw a laceration that was consistent with the ribs on a pair of pliers. Sandoval's right eye was swollen, her bottom lip was cut, and she had what appeared to be scratch marks on the left side of her neck. Sandoval also complained of pain in the left side of her neck and forehead. All of Sandoval's injuries were photographed by CSA Spoor.

VII. AUTOPSY:

On 05-28-2011, at approximately 0730 hours, Dr. Telegenhoff from the Clark County Coroner's Office performed an autopsy on the body of Alberto Castillo where the following persons were in attendance.

12. Apparent gunshot wound to the left side of the back (exit #11)
13. Apparent gunshot wound to the left upper abdomen (entry)
14. Apparent gunshot to the mid lower abdomen (entry)

17. Abrasion on the right calf
18. Abrasion on the right wrist

D. RESULTS OF AUTOPSY

After performing a complete autopsy on the body of Alberto Castillo, Dr. Telgenhoff determined the cause of Castillo's death was multiple gunshot wounds, and the manner of his death was a Homicide. Later toxicological testing revealed the suspect had traces of methamphetamines in his system.

VIII. INVESTIGATION:

(Note: For the purposes of this report, the terms X-26, X-26 Taser, Taser, and Electronic Control Device (ECD) all refer to the X-26 Taser manufactured By Taser International in Scottsdale Arizona.)

CSA Supervisor A. Cabrales, CSA M. Spoor, and CSA J. Albert assisted me with processing the scene inside 2917 Theresa Avenue. CSA R. Dahn responded to the Downtown Area Command Station and photographed the officers involved in the shooting, and counted down their weapons. Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser was recovered at the scene and impound, and his weapon was recovered by CSA Dahn and Detective Sanborn at the Downtown Area Command Station. Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser was recovered and impounded at the Downtown Area Command Station by CSA Dahn.

Although Officers Thompson, Gastelum, and Corbett did not give statements to investigating detectives concerning the confrontation with the suspect based on advice of their legal consul. However, the three officers provided a walk-thru of the scene during which they described their actions, and the actions of the suspect. The officers' walk-thru of the scene was not recorded.

On 05-28-11, Clark County Medical Examiner Dr. Gary Telgenhoff performed an autopsy on the body of Alberto Castillo. Dr. Telgenhoff determined that Castillo had been struck with three ECD darts in the upper torso. Dr. Telgenhoff also determined that Castillo had been shot eight times. Toxicological testing on Castillo was positive for methamphetamine.

On 06-01-2011, I took Officer Thompson and Officer Gastelum's X-26 Tasers to the LVMPD Advanced Training Unit where I met with Officer E. Carlson P# 7208. Officer Carlson downloaded the video files and firing data from Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser serial number X00-056564, and Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser serial number X00-213050.

X-26 Taser s/n X00-056564: The firing data showed four (4), five second discharges on 05-27-2011. All of the discharge times for the purpose of this investigation are GMT, and have been adjusted to achieve the approximate local time when the device was discharged. The times may be off several minutes due to variations in the devices internal clock and local time. Discharge # 1 appears to be a spark check for five seconds at the beginning of Officer Thompson's shift. Discharge # 2 is the cartridge deployment from Officer Thompson's Taser at the scene, and discharge # 3, and 4 are five second discharges after the probes from Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser cartridge were deployed. According to Officer Thompson, discharge # 3 and 4 were "drive stuns." On 06-06-2011, I took this X-26 Taser to Taser International in Phoenix Arizona. The device was examined by Validation Test Lead Brian Childs, and found to be operating within normal limits. On 07-21-2011, the probes were examined by Taser International Technical Services Manger Andrew Hinz. During the examination, Mr. Hinz found that both of the darts deployed by Officer Thompson's "C" series Taser cartridge completed a circuit of more than 2, but less than 5 seconds.

X-26 Taser s/n X00-213050: This X-26 Taser was approximately 3383 days, thirteen hours, eighteen minutes, and sixteen seconds out of date. Based on the extended time difference, I took this X-26 Taser to Taser International for examination and recalibration of the date. Based on the examination by Taser, there were seven discharges of varying times on 05-27-2011. All of the discharge times for the purpose of this investigation are GMT, and have been adjusted to achieve the approximate local time when the device was discharged. The times may be off by several minutes due to variations in the devices internal

clock and local time. Discharge # 1 appears to be a spark check from Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser at the beginning of his shift on 05-27-2011. Discharge # 2 is the cartridge probe deployment from Officer Gastelum's Taser at the scene, and discharges 3 thru 7 are additional discharges of the device at the scene. On 06-06-2011, I took this Officer Gastelum's X-26 to Taser International in Phoenix Arizona. The device was examined by Validation Test Lead Brian Childs, and found to be operating within normal limits. On 07-21-2011, the probes were examined by Taser International Technical Services Manger Andrew Hinz. During the examination, Mr. Hinz found that both of the darts deployed by Officer Gastelum's "T" series Taser cartridge did not completed a circuit, and thus would not have an effect on the suspect.

I reviewed the surveillance video from both X-26 cameras. Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser was the first device to be discharged. Officer Gastelum had his camera/audio on for approximately 7 seconds before he fired the cartridge and deployed the probes. During the first 22 seconds of audio recording, it appeared the camera lens was covered. The microphone on the X-26 recorded a male voice yelling "drop it, drop it, get him, get him" and additional yelling in the background. Once the camera lens was clear, the suspect could be seen lying partially supine on the floor on the south side of the twin bed. As the camera continued to record, it appeared there was some type of struggle which resulted in the camera being violently moved about. Approximately 53 seconds after Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser was turned on multiple gunshots were heard, approximately 1 second later the video showed the suspect on the floor with his back against the television and Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser in his right hand. The suspect was holding Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser by the barrel, and the charge indicator light on the X-26 was illuminated indicating that the X-26 was on. Two seconds after the shooting started, it stopped and a female was heard screaming in the background. Approximately 70 seconds after the video started it stopped.

When I reviewed the video from Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser, I found that the noise of an ECD discharging began immediately after the video started. One second later, the suspect was seen on video with his buttock on the floor, his back against the south side of the twin bed, and he had both hands outstretched toward Officer Gastelum, and it appeared he was grasping Officer Gastelum's X-26 Taser. Based on the location the suspect is reaching, it appears Officer Gastelum is standing on the west side of the queen bed. Four seconds after the video started, a male voice was heard saying "stop tasing me" as the suspect kicked at Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser. Three seconds later, the suspect's right hand can be seen on the video moving toward Officer Thompson's Taser and a male voice yelled "stop resisting." One second after the suspect's hand moved toward Officer Thompson's X-26 Taser, the camera made several quick movements toward the television, the dresser, and the floor. Immediately after the movement of the camera started, and eleven seconds after the video started, several gunshots were fired. Two seconds after the shooting started it stopped and the X-26 camera showed the suspect moving on the floor with the camera lying on his right side. Eleven seconds after the shots were fired, Officer Thompson broadcast over the

radio " shots fired, roll medical." The camera and audio stayed on until the camera automatically shut off approximately 15 minutes after it started.

Sandoval, Xochilth (Suspect's Wife)

On May 27th 2011 at 0944 hours Detective Kisner interviewed Xochilth Sandoval in his vehicle in the 2900 block of Theresa. Also present was Hazel Estrada P# 13072 for Spanish translation. In summary, the following was learned: Sandoval has two children in common with Alberto Castillo. They have been together for 5 or 6 years. They live at 2917 Theresa Avenue with Alberto Castillo's parents. Sandoval and Castillo have two children, (2006), and (2008). Sandoval said Castillo uses methamphetamine, and that he inhales. She said he often uses the drug for several days, and while he is using the drugs he becomes paranoid and fights with her or his father Ines Castillo. Prior to this incident, Castillo had been using methamphetamine for several days and not sleeping. On the night of May 26th 2011, Castillo and Sandoval had a verbal argument about his drug use and his behavior. On the morning of May 27th 2011, Sandoval was in her bedroom with the children when Castillo began walking in and out of the bedroom. Sandoval described Castillo as being in a "Zombie" like state, and acting abnormal. She said Castillo accused her of being a man and not being his wife. Sandoval said when she tried to reason with Castillo he attacked her. She said he slammed her head into a wall then grabbed a pair of pliers and started to torture her while accusing her of being a man. She said Castillo used the pliers on her right and left hands and threatened to cut her fingers off. Sandoval said Castillo then picked up a screwdriver and kept poking her in the neck and shoulder area while he threatened to kill her. Sandoval said she had never seen Castillo lose his self-control before.

Sandoval told Detective Kisner that Castillo has beaten her before and threatened her numerous times in the past but never like he did on 05-27-2011. Sandoval said a friend of Castillo's father named Jovita pleaded with Castillo to stop, and not hurt her in front of the children. Sandoval said Castillo told his father to take the children because he was going to kill her. During the fight, Sandoval said she heard the police arrive and announce themselves at which point Castillo closed the bedroom door in order to keep the police out. She said Castillo had a flat bladed work tool in his hand, and twisted her arm behind her back and held her to the bed as the police entered the room. She said the police and Castillo began yelling in English and Sandoval could not understand what they were saying. Sandoval described how the officers used their 'stun guns' to try and control Castillo, but it did not affect him. She said Castillo was resisting the police officers, but she did not see him attack the officers. She said the officers were very close to Castillo, but they just couldn't get a hold of him, and that's when one officers fire a handgun at Castillo. Sandoval said she heard 3-5 gunshots after which she was taken out of the room. For further details refer to Sandoval's transcribed statement.

On 05-27-2011 at 0733 hours Detective Boucher conducted an audio recorded interview with Ines Castillo at 2917 Theresa Avenue. Castillo is Spanish speaking, therefore Officer G. Valenzuela, P#8396 was present during the interview to translate. During the interview Castillo related the following: Castillo is the owner of 2917 Theresa Avenue, and lives in the house with his wife, Socorro Castillo, his son, Alberto Castillo, Alberto's wife Xochilth Sandoval, and Alberto's two children (5) and (3). He said Socorro was at work when the incident occurred, but a friend of the family, Jovita Picardo, who is visiting from Mexico was in the house. He said Alberto was fighting with Sandoval because he believed she was seeing another man. Ines said Alberto thought the man Sandoval was seeing was named Jose, and that Jose was on the roof. Ines said he went into Alberto's bedroom, and saw Alberto holding Sandoval down on the bed while pushing a screwdriver into her hand. He said Alberto was also hitting Sandoval in the face with his elbow and forearm and telling her "You're Jose, you're Jose," and threatening to kill her. Inez believed Alberto thought Sandoval was Jose. Inez said he told Picardo to call 911. Ines said when the police arrived they told him to go outside, and once outside he heard gunshots. Ines said he knew Alberto used drugs, but felt Alberto's actions and behavior today was much worse than normal. Ines gave his verbal permission for Detectives to enter his house to investigate the incident, and also signed an LVMPD Consent to Search card. For further details refer to Ines Castillo's transcribed statement.

On May 27th 2011 at 1044 hours Detective Kisner interviewed Jovita Lopez Picardo in his vehicle in the 2900 block of Theresa. Also present was Hazel Estrada P# 13072 for Spanish translation. In summary, the following was learned: Pichardo is a friend of the suspect's father Ines Castillo. She arrived in Las Vegas on May 27th 2011 at about 0100 hours from Tijuana. She has only meet Alberto Castillo and Xochilth Sandoval once about two years ago. While she said she was aware of Castillo's previous arrests, she didn't know why he was arrested. She was also not aware of any problems within the family. On the morning of May 27th 2011, Picardo was in the Kitchen at 2917 Theresa Avenue when she heard Castillo and Sandoval fighting in their bedroom. She heard Castillo accusing Sandoval of being a man and not his wife. Picardo said she pleaded with Castillo to stop and not attack Sandoval in front of the

children, but he grabbed Sandoval by her hair and poked her in the body with a screwdriver. Picardo said Castillo's father came to the bedroom and began to plead with Castillo to stop. Picardo said she returned to the kitchen and was followed there by Ines who looked very scared. She said Ines asked her to call the police. While Picardo was on the phone with the police she heard Castillo yelling that he is going to kill Sandoval. Picardo said she was in the kitchen when police arrived, and heard the police yelling at Castillo to put his hands up. Picardo said she heard more yelling then several gunshots after which she took the children to a neighbor's house. For further details refer to Picardo's transcribed statement.

I had the 911 call from Jovita Picardo on 05-27-2011 translated. During the call, Picardo told the operator through a Spanish translator that a person who was drugged was hitting another person inside the house at 2917 Theresa Avenue. Picardo told the operator that the suspect was hitting his wife, and that the suspect, his wife, and their children were locked in a room. Picardo on several occasions pleaded with the dispatcher to hurry because the suspect whom she called Alberto was stabbing his wife with a screwdriver. Picardo also told the operator that the children were screaming. An unidentified male, believed to be the suspect's father Ines Castillo also spoke to the operator and said "my son is trying to kill his wife, please hurry." The operator asked Ines if the suspect still had the screwdriver, and Ines said "yes, the same, he is stabbing her already." For further details refer to Picardo's transcribed 911 call.

On 5-27-11 at approximately 1304 hours, Detective Sanborn interviewed Esmeralda Sanchez in the area of 2917 Theresa Avenue, where she related the following: She was the sister of Alberto Castillo. Over the past couple of years Castillo had been abusing drugs and alcohol. She said he drank Bud lite beer, and believed he used cocaine and meth. Approximately one and a half years ago Castillo lost custody of his children to his ex-wife and she filed a restraining order against him. She said after that, Castillo seemed to not care about anything, and was "basically suicidal." She said Castillo and his girlfriend, Xochilth (Sandoval) had been living with her parents for the last six months. She said Castillo and Sandoval constantly argued and fought, however; the police were rarely called. Approximately one year ago, Castillo was arrested for domestic violence for a fight he had with his father, and Sandoval defended Castillo. Sanchez said her father (Ines Castillo) told her this morning that Castillo was hallucinating and trying to kill Sandoval. For further details refer to Esmeralda Sanchez' transcribed statement.

On May 27th, 2011, at approximately 9:30 hours, Detective Embrey conducted a recorded interview with Las Vegas Fire and Rescue EMT R. Lawrence. Lawrence he was dispatched to 2917 Theresa Avenue regarding a female that was stabbed. Lawrence said they held short until the police advised it was safe for them to enter the scene. He said once it was safe a police officer told him that someone had been shot. Lawrence said he and Paramedic J. Murray entered the residence and found a male in the back bedroom laying face down on the floor with his arms handcuffed behind his back. Lawrence said they had the officers remove their handcuffs from the suspect so they could treat him. Lawrence said in order to treat the suspect they had to roll him over. Lawrence said he removed some tazer probes from the suspect's chest area and lifted his shirt up. Lawrence said Paramedic Murray determined that the suspect was deceased, and they exited the residence. Lawrence said one he stepped outside he noticed something was stuck to the sole of his right boot. Lawrence said when he reached down and pulled the object out of his sole of his boot he noticed that it was an empty shell casing. He said he left the shell casing on the ground by the front door. For further details refer to Lawrence's transcribed statement.

IX. FIREARM EXAMINATION

LVMPD Firearms James Krylo, examined Officer Thompson's Glock 17 pistol. After test firing the pistol, Mr. Krylo found Officer Thompson's firearm to be in normal operating condition with no malfunctions. The trigger pull was determined to be 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ to 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ pounds. The barrel length of Officer Thompson's pistol was 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches with an overall length of 7 $\frac{7}{8}$ inches. The pistol and one magazine have a maximum capacity of 18 cartridges.

A. BULLET COMPARISON

The bullets recovered from Albert Castillo's body, and the bullets recovered at the scene were microscopically compared to a test fired bullet from Officer Thompson's Glock pistol. Based on the comparative examination, it was determined the bullets recovered are marked with the same general rifling characteristics as Officer Thompson's pistol, but lack sufficient microscopic detail for a positive identification.

B. CARTRIDGE CASE EXAMINATION

The test fired cartridge casing from the Officer Thompson's Glock pistol was microscopically compared to the evidence casings. Based on these comparative examinations, Mr. Krylo determined the eight cartridge casings recovered at the scene had all been fired from Officer Thompson's Glock pistol.

On 06-20-2011, I received permission from Chief Deputy District Attorney Christopher Laurent to release Officer Thompson's Glock pistol back to Officer Thompson. The pistol was released on 06-21-2011.

X. CONCLUSION:

Based on interviews with the suspect's family, and his girlfriend Xochilt Sandoval, it appears the suspect was involved in a violent domestic dispute with Sandoval which prompted the suspect father to have a family friend call 911 and request the police. When the officers arrived, the suspect was sitting on a bed in the master bedroom with an apparent weapon to Sandoval's neck. The officers ordered the suspect to drop the weapon and release Sandoval and when he refused to comply they fired their Tasers at the suspect. The suspect still did not comply with the officers' orders to stop resisting at which point he grabbed Officer Gastelum's Taser, and kicked at Officers Thompson and Corbett. When Officer Thompson fired his Taser at the suspect, the suspect still did not comply and pulled Officer Thompson's Taser from his hand at which point Officer Thompson fired eight times from his 9mm pistol killing the suspect. When Officer Thompson shot the suspect, the distance from Officer Thompson to the suspect was approximately 5'10".

XI. CORONER'S INQUEST:

As of 07-20-2011, the Coroner's Inquest process has been placed on an indefinite hold by the District Court pending a hearing. Once a decision is made as to the future of the inquest process, or another form of review of this shooting is conducted this section will be updated.
