III. INCIDENT DETAILS

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 0724 hours, LVMPD Dispatch received multiple 911 calls reference a subject who appeared to have been shot. The location of the incident was a self-service car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue. LVMPD officers arrived and located a male, identified as Thomas Romero Jr., who had sustained multiple gunshot wounds. Romero was transported to University Medical Center (UMC) Trauma Center. Witnesses described the suspect vehicle to officers as a black Ford Expedition with large rims and chrome around the tail lights. The vehicle was seen traveling east on E. Searles Avenue. LVMPD Gang/Vice Bureau, Gangs Section detectives responded to the scene and began an investigation.

LVMPD uniformed officers and plainclothes detectives attempted to locate the suspect vehicle in the area. At approximately 0930 hours, a plainclothes detective located a vehicle which matched the description of the suspect vehicle. Officer William Umana responded in an LVMPD marked patrol vehicle and located and attempted to stop the vehicle near Mojave Road and Bonanza Road. When Officer Umana activated his emergency lights and siren, the driver of the Ford Expedition sped up in an attempt to flee from the officer. Officer Umana broadcast the information over his radio.

As Officer Umana pursued the Ford Expedition, he broadcast over the radio that the driver, who was later identified as Rene Nunez, had a firearm. There was a passenger in the vehicle, later identified as Fidel Miranda. Officer Umana broadcast he was being shot at by Nunez and Miranda. The pursuit continued south on Mojave Road as Miranda fired multiple times from the vehicle at Officer Umana. The Ford Expedition entered the intersection of Bonanza Road and Mojave Road, where another uniformed patrol officer, Officer James Parker, had set up to intercept the suspect vehicle. As the Ford Explorer passed Officer Parker, Nunez pointed a firearm at him, and Officer Parker believed Nunez had fired at him.

The pursuit continued west on Charleston Boulevard from Mojave Road, with Nunez driving westbound in eastbound lanes into oncoming traffic. As they reached the intersection of Charleston Boulevard and Eastern Avenue, Nunez turned north onto Eastern Avenue. Miranda leaned his entire upper body out of the passenger window and faced the officers as he fired. As they proceeded north on Eastern Avenue, Sergeant Kobrys joined the pursuit and attempted a precision intervention technique (PIT) on the Ford Expedition. As Sergeant Kobrys attempted the maneuver to stop the pursuit, Miranda fired at him and struck Sergeant Kobrys' patrol vehicle. Sergeant Kobrys swerved to avoid being hit by gunfire, drove over a median, and flattened his tires. Nunez and Miranda continued to flee.

Nunez and Miranda approached Ogden Avenue as a marked LVMPD patrol vehicle occupied by Officers Michael Roe and Tyler Georgi, set up facing oncoming traffic so they could intercept the Ford Expedition. Officer Roe, who was driving the patrol vehicle, planned to ram the Ford Expedition, however, Nunez turned the vehicle at the last moment and headed west on Ogden Avenue. Officer Umana was once again behind the Ford Expedition. During a lull in gunfire Officer Umana pulled directly behind Nunez and Miranda and fired through his front windshield at their vehicle. Nunez did not stop the vehicle. Officer Umana was able to pull alongside of the Ford Expedition and again fired at Nunez and Miranda. The Ford Expedition slowed and had pulled toward the lanes of oncoming traffic when Nunez opened the driver door and fled the vehicle. Nunez ran up a flight of stairs at Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School located at 1776 E. Ogden Avenue.

Officer Umana exited his patrol vehicle, and Miranda climbed from the passenger seat into the driver seat of the Ford Expedition. Miranda put the Ford Expedition into reverse, and Officer Umana and Officer Paul Solomon fired at Miranda. After quickly backing up, Miranda put the vehicle in drive, moved forward, and struck a wall at the side of the elementary school and came to a stop.

A perimeter was established as two arrest teams were formed to take Nunez and Miranda into custody. One arrest team moved up the flight of stairs, and with assistance from a K-9 dog, took

Nunez into custody. Nunez was transported to UMC for treatment of injuries sustained during the incident. The other team moved to the Ford Expedition, removed Miranda from the vehicle, and took him into custody. Miranda was pronounced deceased at the scene.

LVMPD Gang Section detectives responded to handle the investigation of the shooting of Thomas Romero. Shortly after the pursuit had ended, information was obtained that Romero had been pronounced deceased at 1012 hours. LVMPD homicide detectives were requested to respond. Due to the officer-involved shooting (OIS) aspect of the incident, detectives from the Force Investigation Team (FIT) were requested and responded to the scene to conduct the investigation. After the initial briefing had been conducted, it was determined Gang Section and Homicide detectives would relinquish the investigation to FIT. DTAC Patrol Investigative detectives and Gang Section detectives assisted in the investigation. Interviews were conducted with all victims and witnesses, video footage was collected, and neighborhoods were canvassed.

Following the briefing Detective Leavitt was assigned as the lead case agent and tasked with the responsibility of documenting the crime scene with crime scene analysts. Detectives Alsup, Colon, Hodson, Mendoza, Patton, and Ubbens were assigned to interview available witnesses and conduct weapon countdowns. Detective Penny was assigned responsibilities at the hospital, which included interviewing any possible witnesses.

IV. BODY WORN CAMERAS

Involved Officers

Officer William Umana

Officer Umana was wearing a body worn camera (BWC) at the time of the incident, and the camera was activated. The camera was collected by Lieutenant Erik Lloyd and secured. The video footage captured was later viewed by Officer Umana at approximately 1453 hours on July 11, 2018.

Officer Umana's camera footage depicted the following events:

Officer Umana was being directed over the radio by a plainclothes detective who was following a vehicle possibly involved in a shooting earlier that morning. While Officer Umana traveled south on Mojave Road, a broadcast over the radio was given that the possible suspect vehicle turned north on Mojave Road from Washington Avenue. A black Ford Expedition traveling in the opposite direction of Officer Umana passed him. Officer Umana quickly made a U-turn to follow it.

Officer Umana broadcast over the radio he was behind the vehicle as the driver of the Ford Expedition made a U-turn in the middle of the street to change direction and proceeded south. Sergeant Kobrys broadcast over the radio, "We will pursue if he takes off because of the crime." While that radio transmission was being broadcast, Officer Umana activated his overhead lights, the Ford Expedition accelerated, and Officer Umana pursued. As the pursuit passed south through Washington Avenue, Officer Umana was attempting to broadcast on the radio, but was unable because of other radio transmissions. Just south of Washington Avenue, as Officer

Umana was able to broadcast over the radio, several gunshots were heard as the Ford Expedition accelerated.

As Officer Umana followed the Ford Expedition past 805 N. Mojave Road, faint gunfire was heard. Officer Umana broadcast this information over the radio. As the two vehicles prepared to pass through Bonanza Road, Officer Umana again broadcast that additional shots had been fired. They are south from Bonanza Road, nearing 501 N. Mojave Road, when Officer Umana broadcast, "Shots fired still." He continued the pursuit, and broadcast the driver had a "413" (gun) in his hand. Officer Umana requested the Air Unit as the pursuit went underneath US 95. Additional gunshots were heard as Officer Umana broadcast the updates.

The Ford Expedition turned west on Charleston Boulevard from Mojave Road; Officer Umana continued to follow. As they made the westbound turn, the Ford Expedition crossed over the center median and traveled against traffic (west in eastbound lanes) while Officer Umana continued in the westbound travel lanes. While westbound at 28th Street, the Ford Expedition traveled back into the westbound lanes; Officer Umana continued the pursuit. As the pursuit entered the area where Fremont Street, Charleston Boulevard, and Eastern Avenue intersect, an area commonly referred to as "Five Points," additional patrol units merged with the pursuit. The additional units got behind the Ford Expedition as it again crossed the center median and traveled against traffic westbound in the eastbound lanes. The distance from oncoming traffic was very short as the Ford Expedition made a northbound turn onto Eastern Avenue. The passenger of the Ford Expedition was seen leaning out of the open passenger window, and additional gunshots were heard.

As the vehicles proceeded north on Eastern Avenue, traffic was congested and the Ford Expedition weaved between cars before it made a sharp turn to proceed west on Ogden Avenue. Officer Umana was directly behind the vehicle, and rolled his driver window down as he drew his firearm from his holster with his right hand. While westbound at 23rd Street, Officer Umana transitioned his firearm into his left hand and attempted to aim the firearm at the Ford Expedition, but immediately transitioned back to his right hand. Using one hand, Officer Umana aimed his firearm at the Ford Expedition and fired approximately five rounds through the windshield of his patrol vehicle. Both vehicles continued west and as they passed through Cervantes Street, Officer Umana let go of the steering wheel and used a two-handed firing grip to fire approximately six times toward the Ford Expedition. The driver of the Ford Expedition did not stop or slow down after either volley of gunfire and continued driving west. As the vehicles neared 18th Street, the street widened and Officer Umana pulled along the passenger side of the Ford Expedition. Officer Umana extended his right hand out the open driver window of his patrol vehicle and fired into the Ford Expedition approximately seven times.

The Ford Expedition traveled to the south side of the road as it drove toward the side of a building (Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School) and slowed almost to a stop. As Officer Umana opened his door, the driver of the Ford Expedition (later identified as Rene Nunez) exited the driver's side of the vehicle. Nunez ran up a flight of stairs onto the school property as the Ford Expedition continued to roll. Officer Umana yelled at Nunez to "get down" as he (Officer Umana) placed a new magazine in his firearm. The passenger of the Ford Expedition (later identified as Fidel Miranda) moved into the driver's seat as the vehicle continued to roll and hit a wall of the school. The Ford Expedition reversed and the back tires began to spin and smoke. Officer

Umana fired approximately 14 rounds toward the driver's side of the Ford Expedition as he moved on foot from his patrol vehicle toward the school. The vehicle went forward, again struck the wall next to the school, and then came to a stop. Officer Umana stopped behind cover of a brick wall near the stairs Nunez had run up to flee. One more gunshot was heard, but it was not fired by Officer Umana. (That gunshot was later identified as the round fired by Officer Solomon.)

Officer Umana pointed his weapon toward the top of the stairs as additional officers converged on the area. Officer Umana told them Nunez had run up the stairs. The additional officers that arrived yelled verbal commands at Miranda to exit the vehicle. Officer Umana maintained cover behind the wall as Miranda was challenged and given commands to exit the vehicle. A patrol vehicle drove east on Ogden Avenue, and K-9 Officer Ledogar and his dog moved along side of it to join up with Officer Umana and other officers.

A plan was implemented with Officer Ledogar to form an element and move up the stairwell. Officer Umana joined this group and conducted a tactical reload of his weapon. The dog was sent in to distract Nunez, biting him as officers approached. Nunez was then taken into custody. While officers were addressing Nunez, radio traffic was heard broadcasting Miranda had been removed from the vehicle and taken into custody.

The BWC continued to record as Officer Umana walked through the scene and met with his sergeant.

Officer Paul Solomon

Officer Solomon was not wearing a BWC at the time of the incident.

Victim Officers

Sergeant Brian Kobry's

Sergeant Kobry's was wearing a BWC at the time of the incident, and the camera was activated. Sergeant Kobry's camera footage depicted the following events:

Sergeant Kobry's BWC was activated as he was at the northwest portion of the school. He made the statement, "Ah, shit, was I not recording?" He then moved along the edge of the school toward a center courtyard which was behind a locked gate. Sergeant Kobry's then led a team of officers over the locked gate into the courtyard. Once inside the courtyard he worked on getting a key or bolt cutters to access the location where Nunez had ran. The team maintained their position as a separate team of officers moved from the east and took Nunez into custody. Sergeant Kobry's informed his team that he had been shot at by the suspects (Nunez and Miranda).

Sergeant Kobry's team was given a key by school staff which was used to open the gate. As they opened the gate, they joined the officers which had come from the east and took Nunez into custody.

Officer James Parker

Officer Parker was wearing a BWC at the time of the incident, and the camera was activated. Officer Parker's camera footage depicted the following events:

Officer Parker was being directed over the radio by a plainclothes detective who was following a vehicle possibly involved in a shooting earlier that morning. While Officer Parker was traveling north on Mojave Road, Officer Umana broadcast over the radio he was in pursuit of the suspect vehicle that was traveling south on Mojave Road. A black Ford Expedition cut between stopped vehicles, running the red light while south on Mojave Road at Bonanza Road. As the black Ford Expedition passed Officer Parker, he broadcast over the radio, "The driver has a 413 (gun) in his hand." As Officer Parker made a U-turn to follow Officer Umana and join the pursuit. Officer Parker broadcast the pursuit details over the radio as he was the secondary vehicle. As they approached Charleston Boulevard, Officer Parker updated that speeds were 70 miles per hour, and for following vehicles not to get directly behind the Ford Expedition because the passenger was firing out of the window.

Officer Parker continued to give updated information as the vehicle traveled west on Charleston Boulevard. The Ford Expedition made a northbound turn onto Eastern Avenue as patrol vehicles followed. As the Ford Expedition turned, several gunshots were heard on the BWC. Officer Parker broadcast over the radio "shots fired," and the passenger was leaning out of the passenger window firing at officers. As Officer Parker called out pursuit information, the Air Unit (AIR3) began to broadcast. Officer Parker stopped broadcasting over the radio, allowing AIR3 to take control. Officer Parker remained in the pursuit as the vehicles turned westbound on Ogden Avenue from Eastern Avenue. While on Ogden Avenue, Officer Parker broadcast over the radio for the primary unit to back up because the Ford Expedition was shooting at them.

When the Ford Expedition reached 18th Street it began to turn to the left and slowed as the driver door opened. Officer Parker broadcast over the radio "We're bailing. We're bailing." The driver (Nunez) exited the vehicle on foot and ran up a flight of stairs at the elementary school. The vehicle, which had almost come to a full stop when it hit the school, suddenly reversed and appeared to again head west on Ogden Avenue. As the vehicle moved, Officer Umana exited from his patrol vehicle, and moved on foot toward the school as he fired into the Ford Expedition. Several patrol vehicles converged on the area. A plainclothes officer (Paul Solomon) armed with a shotgun moved toward the Ford Expedition, and a single gunshot was heard. Officer Parker moved from his vehicle toward the north side of the street as he looked for cover. Other officers gave commands to the suspect (Miranda) to exit the vehicle.

Officers held their positions while a plan was put into place to move up the stairs and take Nunez into custody, as well as getting Miranda from the vehicle and into custody. Officer Parker's BWC remained on as he moved around the perimeter and spoke to other officers about the pursuit and shooting. Officer Parker told several officers that Nunez and Miranda passed the gun back and forth during the pursuit and both of them fired at officers.

Officer Michael Roe

Officer Roe was wearing a BWC at the time of the incident, and the camera was activated. Officer Roe's camera footage depicted the following events:

Officer Roe and his partner, Officer Tyler Georgi, responded with lights and siren toward the pursuit (Officer Roe was driving) and followed the directions given by Officer Umana. Gunfire was heard over the radio. As they arrived to the area of the pursuit, Officer Roe was heard telling Officer Georgi, "Hey, if we get an opportunity to do this, make sure your seatbelt's on. We're fucking ramming this damn car."

As Officer Roe drove south on Eastern Avenue approaching Ogden Avenue, he pulled into the northbound lanes to face oncoming traffic. As Officer Roe faced south in the northbound lanes, there was a white van slightly to his right in the #1 travel lane (far right lane); the black Ford Expedition was in the #2 travel lane headed directly for Officers Roe and Georgi's vehicle. Just before the vehicles would have collided, the driver of the Ford Expedition made a hard left turn to proceed west on Ogden Avenue. The vehicles did not impact each other, and Officer Roe was heard saying, "I missed them. Fuck."

Officer Roe turned his vehicle around and followed other patrol vehicles west on Ogden Avenue. Someone broadcast over the radio, "We're bailing. We're bailing," as Officers Roe and Georgi reached 18th Street and Ogden Avenue. Officers Roe and Georgi arrived in the area at the time of the broadcast, and the suspect vehicle was seen facing Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School, as if it crashed into the north side of the school. Four other patrol vehicles were seen at the termination point of the pursuit, the closest to the Ford Expedition being Officer Umana's. Officer Umana was just to the north of the Ford Expedition, and was seen exiting his vehicle. As Officer Umana exited his vehicle, the Ford Expedition reversed at a high rate of speed toward Officer Umana and his vehicle. Officer Umana moved south across the street and fired toward the Ford Expedition.

Officer Roe pulled to the left (south) of Officer Umana as the Ford Expedition moved forward, crashing into the north wall of the school. The other patrol units that converged at the pursuit termination point ran up with weapons drawn and covered on the Ford Expedition. Officer Roe warned the officers of crossfire. He stated he would take the lead in issuing verbal commands to the suspect (Miranda) who was still inside of the vehicle. Officer Roe issued verbal commands to Miranda to exit the vehicle. Officer Roe advised the units surrounding the vehicle they would not be moving up on the Ford Expedition.

K-9 Officer Ledogar approached the area and moved to the stairwell in front of Officer Roe where Nunez had run. Verbal commands continued being issued to Miranda, who no longer appeared to be moving. A team of officers joined Officer Ledogar and moved up the stairwell to take Nunez into custody. As the team moved, Officer Roe advised Officer Umana to conduct a tactical reload of his weapon.

While the officers were addressing Nunez, a plan was made to take Miranda into custody. Another group of officers, to include Officer Roe, formed a team and they moved toward the Ford Expedition. Miranda was pulled out of the vehicle and placed on the ground. Officers reached

into the vehicle through the open front driver window and turned off the Ford Expedition. Officer Roe then cleared the area around the Ford Expedition of officers to secure the crime scene. During conversations between officers, it was discovered Officer Solomon fired a shotgun.

Additional BWCs

During this incident officers from all over the Las Vegas Valley heard the radio broadcast and began to respond. The majority of those officers wore BWCs, which were activated; however, they did not capture relevant footage. Many of the activated cameras captured an officer as he or she drove toward the event, but were turned off due to them diverting after the suspects had been taken into custody. Some of the officers responded to the original homicide scene, but did not witness the homicide. There is BWC footage which depicted officers who were positioned on a perimeter location, doing traffic control, or who went directly to the command post (CP). Those officers never witnessed the OIS or the suspects' actions.

The below list of officers activated their BWCs, but did not capture anything of significance.

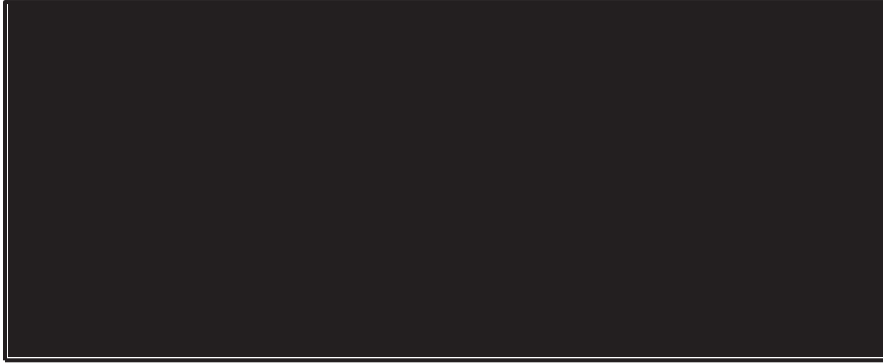

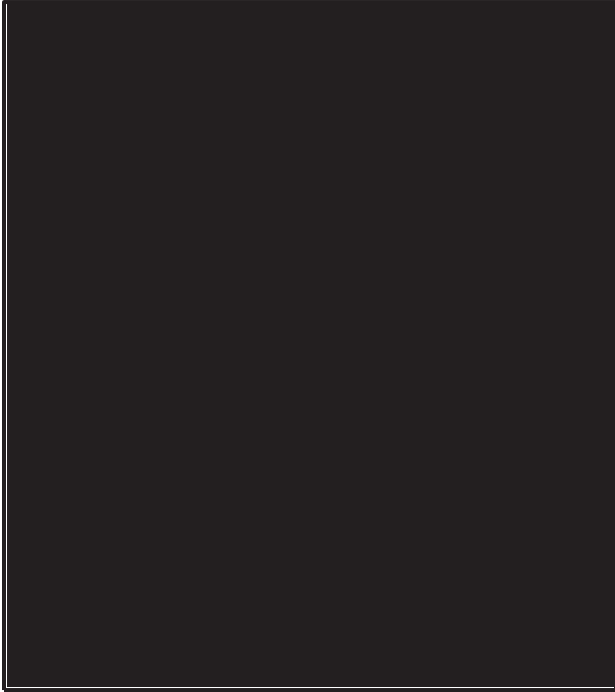

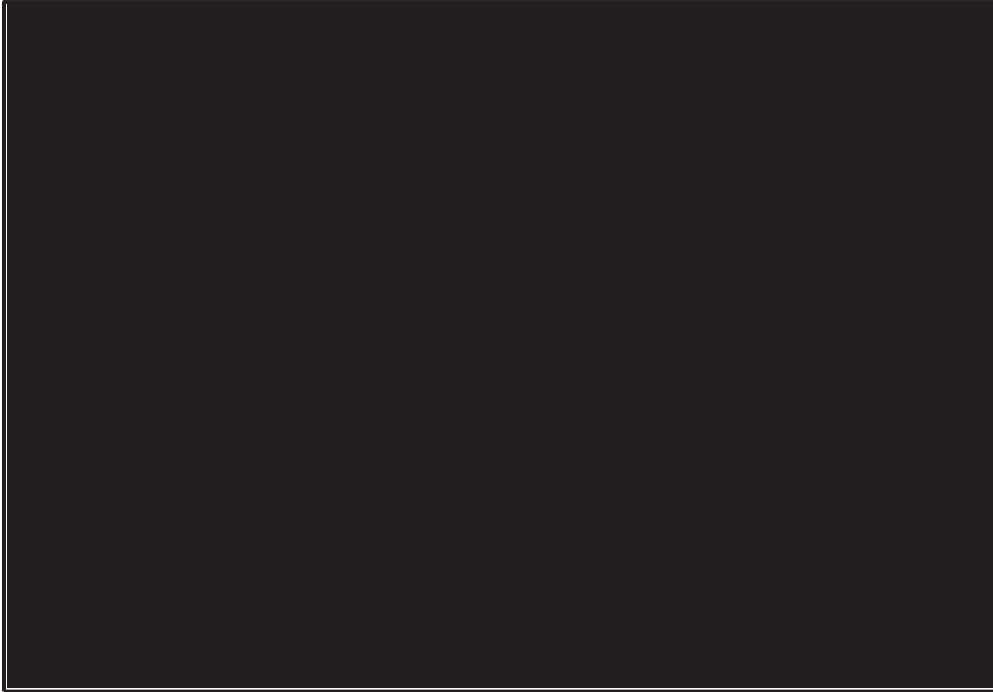

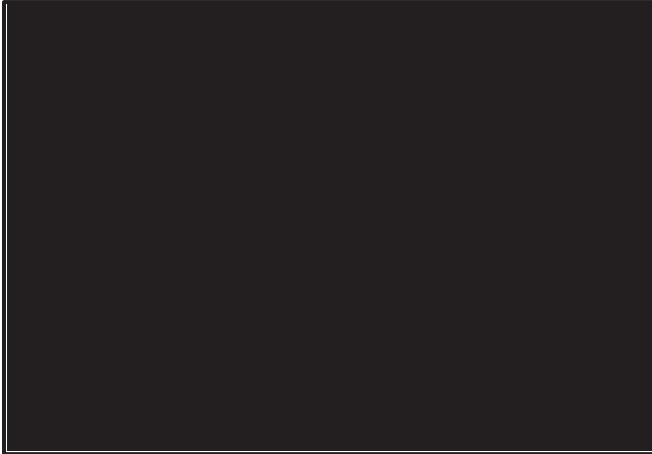

VI. SCENE WALK-THROUGHS

The purpose of the scene walk-through was to help investigators develop an understanding of the scene, including identifying officer location(s) at the time deadly force was used, identifying potential physical evidence, and re-creating a timeline of the incident.

Officer William Umana

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1510 hours, Officer Umana provided a walk-through of the scene in the presence of the following persons:

- 1) Lieutenant Lloyd
- 2) Detective Alsup
- 3) Detective Leavitt
- 4) CSA Supervisor Martin
- 5) LVPPA attorney John Harper

During the walk-through, which was not video or audio recorded, Officer Umana relayed the following information via John Harper:

Officer Umana stated it appeared that every time the suspects stopped firing it was to reload. There would be a break in gunfire, they would reload, and fire again. Officer Umana wanted to stop the threat during a break in firing. Officer Umana knew the suspects were reloading and would again shoot at him. Around 21st or 23rd street Officer Umana fired out the driver's window. When the car came to a stop, Officer Umana stepped out of the vehicle and was moving while shooting toward the suspect vehicle.

Officer Paul Solomon

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1523 hours, Officer Solomon provided a walk-through of the scene in the presence of the following persons:

- 1) Lieutenant Lloyd
- 2) Detective Alsup
- 3) Detective Leavitt
- 4) CSA Supervisor Martin
- 5) LVPPA attorney John Harper

During the walk-through, which was not video or audio recorded, Officer Solomon relayed the following information:

Officer Solomon had been the passenger in his vehicle. He grabbed the shotgun (LVMPD owned/issued), and moved to the west as he exited his vehicle. He believed the passenger in the suspect vehicle got into the backseat and had been reloading his firearm and was going to fire again.

VII. PUBLIC SAFETY STATEMENT

Officer Paul Solomon

On July 11, 2018 at approximately 1304 hours, Detective Ubbens interviewed Sergeant Harries in reference to the Public Safety Statement (PSS) he obtained from Officer Solomon. Also present during the interview was LVPMSA representative Russell Wood. Below is the transcript of the interview.

Note: Detective Ubbens is designated by (AU) and Sergeant Harries is designated by (JH).

AU: This is Detective Ubbens, P# 13119, with the Force Investigation Team. Today is July 11, 2018 at 1304 hours. Currently at 76...1776 Ogden, Las Vegas, NV, conducting a Public Safety Statement interview with Sergeant J. Harries, Henry-Adam-Robert-Robert-Ida-Easy-Sam, P# 10021. Call sign [REDACTED]. Also present is Sergeant Russ Wood, P# 5266. This is reference the Public Safety Statement to Officer Solomon, P# 8827. Um, Sergeant Harries, you understand that we're recording this interview?

JH: Yes.

AU: Okay. Uh, do you...did you give a Public...or take a Public Safety Statement from Officer Solomon?

JH: Yes.

AU: Uh, what time was that?

JH: 0950.

AU: Okay. And do you remember what you asked him and what his responses were?

JH: I do. What me to start?

AU: Yup.

JH: Uh, first I asked him [question] 1: "Did you discharge your firearm?" He responded, "Yes."
A follow up to that: "If so, in what direction?" He said, "Southwest."

Uh, "Approximately where were you located when you fired?" Said, "Somewhere behind the first officer."

"How many shots do you think you fired?" He said, "One."

And then asked, "Is any...anyone injured?" He said, "Officers aren't injured."

Follow-up: "If so, where are they located?" and he said, "The suspect is down near...at the vehicle."

Number 3 I asked him: "Are there any outstanding suspects?" He replied, "No."

Uh, follow-up to that was, "What crime, uh...what crimes have been committed?" He responded, "Attempt murder, um, and AWDW, BWDW, um, on officers."

The other follow-ups weren't, uh, relevant reference the suspect.

Uh, another follow up was, "What type of weapon did they have?" He said, "A pistol, I believe."

I then asked, "Is it possible the suspect fired rounds at you?" He responded, "Yes."

Follow-up: "If so, what direction were the rounds fired from?" He said, "Eastbound."

"How many shots do you think the suspect fired?" He said, "When I was on scene, maybe one or two."

"Approximately where was the suspect located when they fired?" He said, "Out of the passenger window."

I then asked, "Do you know if any other officers discharged their firearms?" He said, "Yes."

I said, "If so, who are they?" He said, "Umana."

I then asked, "Approximately where was the officer located when he fired?" He said, "In front of me, off to the side."

I then asked, "Are there any weapons or evidence that need to be secured or protected?"

He replied, "In the car," referring to the suspects' vehicle.

Um, and then I asked, "Are you aware of any witnesses? And if so, what is their location?"

And he replied, "There were people all over the place," but he couldn't narrow down any specific locations.

AU: Okay. Time is 1307. Same people present.

Officer William Umana

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1308 hours, Detective Ubbens interviewed Sergeant Harries in reference to the PSS he obtained from Officer Umana. Also present during the interview was LVPMSA representative Russell Wood. Below is the transcript of the interview.

Note: Detective Ubbens is designated by (AU) and Sergeant Harries is designated by (JH).

AU: *This is Detective Ubbens, U-B-B-E-N-S, P# 13119, reference Event# 180711-0889. Today is July 11, 2018 at 1308 hours. Currently at 1776 Ogden, Las Vegas, NV, conducting a Public Safety interview with Sergeant J. Harries, Henry-Adam-Robert-Robert-Ida-Easy-Sam, P# 10021. Call sign [REDACTED]. Um, Sergeant Harries, are you aware that this interview's being recorded?*

JH: *Yes.*

AU: *Um, earlier today did you conduct a Public Safety Statement with Officer Umana, P# 7441?*

JH: *Yes.*

AU: *Uh, what time did you do that interview?*

JH: *Uh, 1000 hours.*

AU: *And do you remember what you asked him and what his responses were?*

JH: *I do.*

AU: *Can you go over those with me?*

JH: *Uh, I can.*

"Did you discharge your firearm?" He replied, "Yes."

Then I asked, "If so, in what direction?" He replied, "West and southwest."

I asked, "Approximately where were you located when you fired?" He said, "Around Ogden at 19th and Ogden at 18th."

And then I asked, "How many shots do you think you fired?" He said, "About 31."

Uh, "Is anyone injured?" Uh, he said, "Beside the suspect, no."

I then asked, "Are there any outstanding suspects?" He said, "No. I only saw two."

So the follow-ups to that were rr...irrelevant; I did not ask them.

Uh, I then...I did ask, "What crimes have been committed?" He said, "Attempt murder and attempt murder on a police officer."

I then asked, "What type of weapon did they have?" He said, "A handgun, and it was chrome."

I then asked, "Is it possible the suspect fired rounds at you?" He said...hh...his reply was, "Yes, he did."

Follow-up: "If so, what direction were the rounds fired from?" He said, "On Mojave Road, between Bonanza and Washington, he was shooting north. And again at Charleston and Mojave Road, he was shooting north."

"How many shots do you think the suspect fired?" He replied, "It seemed like it never ended. He reloaded several times."

I then asked, "Approximately where was the suspect located when they fired?" He replied, "Passenger side of the vehicle, approximately 60 to 70 feet."

I then asked, "Do you have..." or, "Do you know if any other officers discharged their firearms?" He replied, "I heard the shotgun."

Uh, "If so, who are they?" And then hh...at that point, he ss...his, uh, reply was, "I heard it was Solomon."

(An approximately nine second pause)

Um, sorry. Oh, whenever I asked him, "Approximately where was the officer located when they fired?" he replied, "Behind me."

I then asked, "Are there any weapons or evidence that need to be secured or protected?"

He replied, "In the car," again referring to the suspect vehicle.

I then asked, "Are you aware of any witnesses? And if so, what is their location?" He replied, "I can't remember. I don't know."

AU: Okay. And also present was, um, Sergeant Wood, P# 5266. Time is 1311 hours.

VIII. OFFICER WEAPON COUNTDOWNS

On July 11, 2018, Officers Solomon and Umana had their duty weapons counted down at LVMPD headquarters. Officer Solomon and Umana were photographed by CSI personnel for appearance purposes and their weapons were photographed for identification purposes.

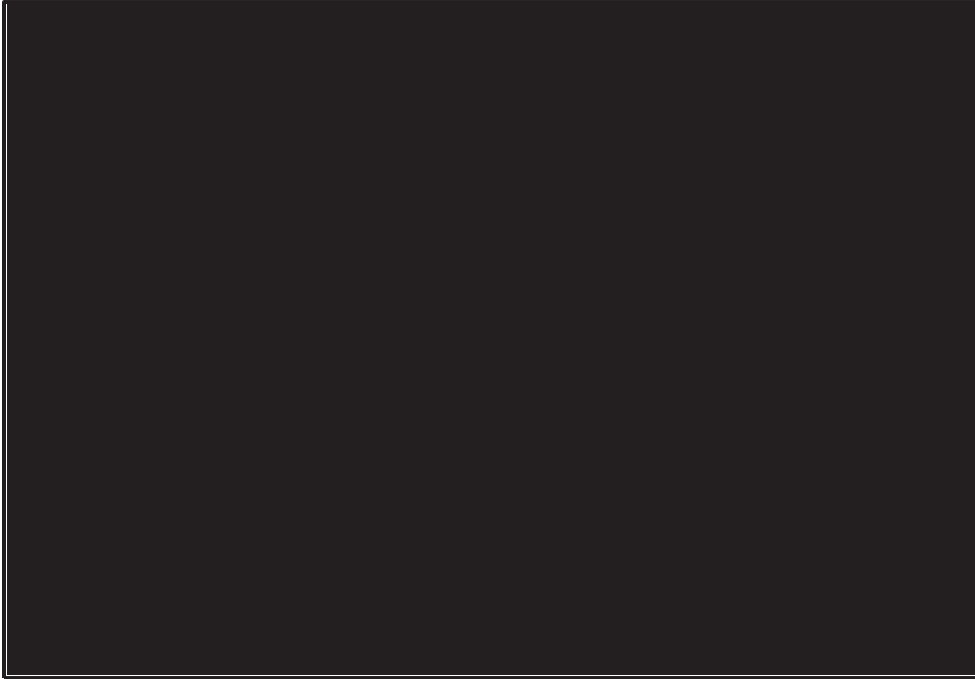

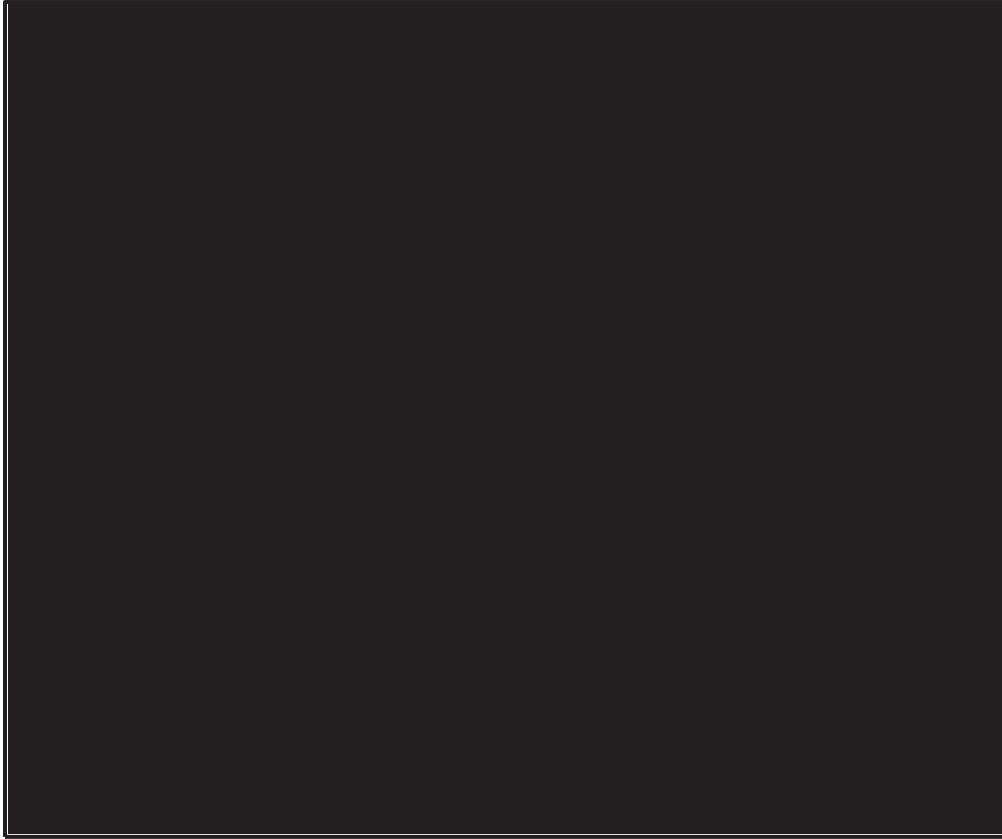

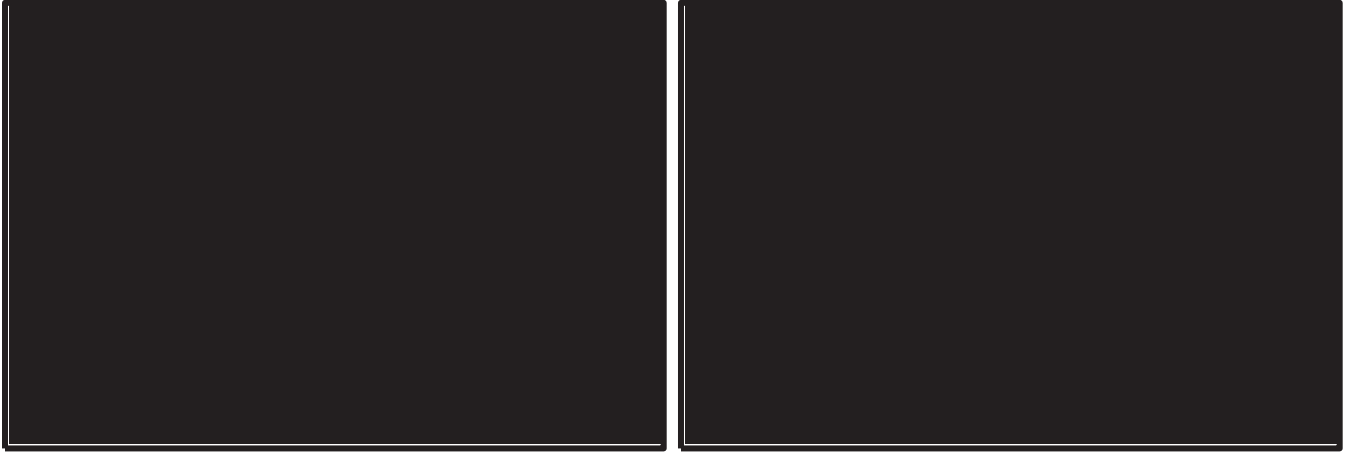

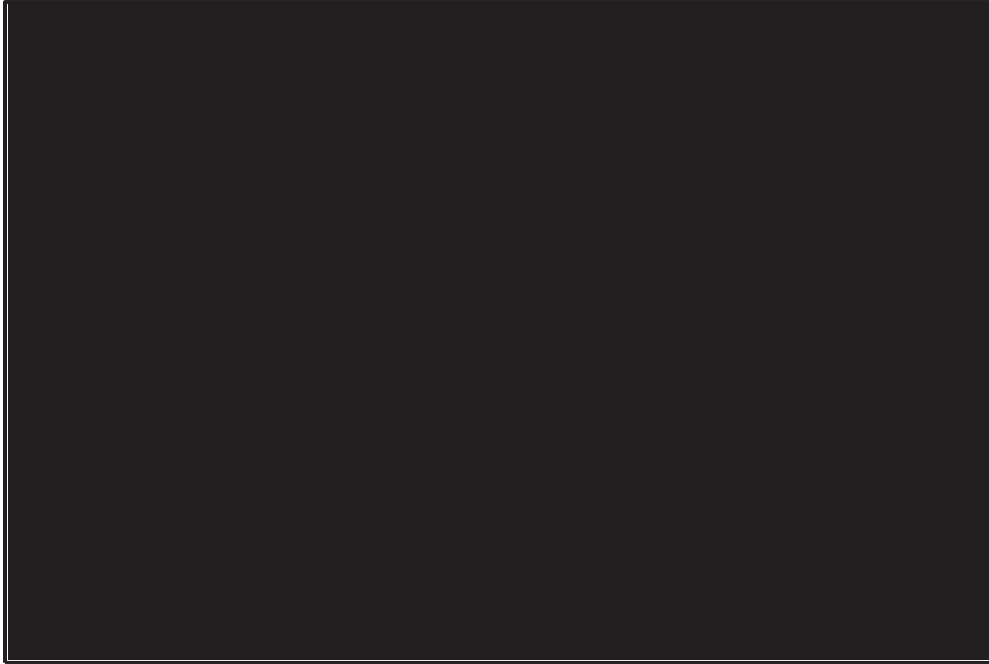

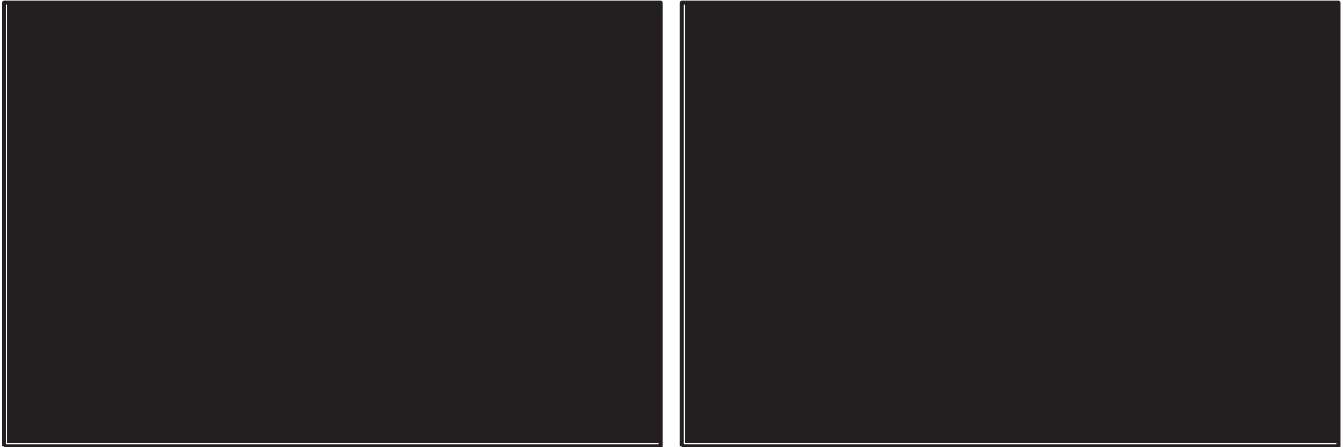

XI. THIRD PARTY VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHIC EVIDENCE

Green Valley Grocery – 500 Conestoga Way (Henderson)

The Green Valley Grocery located at 500 Conestoga Way provided video footage to LVMPD. The business had an exterior and interior camera that time and date stamped the video. According to the exterior camera time and date stamp on the video, a black Ford Expedition pulled into the parking lot on 07-11-18 at 08:19 hours. The Ford Expedition pulled in front of the business, and the driver opened the door and exited the vehicle. The vehicle was then driven away from the front of the business, however, nobody was seen getting into the driver seat. The vehicle turned around in the parking lot and appeared to set up to exit the business, however, at that point it was out of camera view.

The interior camera of the business was positioned behind the register and allowed some view of customers who entered and paid for merchandise. The time and date stamp was unreadable

due to blending with the background. A male, later identified as Fidel Miranda, entered the business and then approached the register with a 12 pack of Pepsi. Miranda used an EBT card, which belonged to Nunez to pay for the item, then left the business.

According to the time stamp at 08:20 hours, the Ford Expedition pulled back in front of the business and in camera view. At 08:22 hours, Miranda entered the passenger side of the vehicle and it pulled away and left the parking lot.

Circle K – 1140 E. Charleston Boulevard

The Circle K located at 1140 E. Charleston Boulevard provided video footage to LVMPD. The business had an interior camera with an internal time and date stamp. According to the time and date stamp on the video, a male believed to be Nunez entered the front doors to the business on 07-11-18 at 02:38 hours. Nunez was alone and approached the register. Nunez pointed out the window and it appeared as though he used cash to pay for gas. He then went farther into the business before returning with items, which he paid for using an EBT card which belonged to him.

Nunez exited the business and went to a vehicle at the gas pumps, which appeared to be the Ford Expedition. Nunez returned to the inside of the business and he went into the gaming area. It appeared Nunez spoke to somebody before leaving the business.

1301 N. Mojave Road

Detective Michael Eddington, P# 14206, of the Gang/Vice Bureau canvassed the surrounding neighborhoods and businesses near the homicide scene at the car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue. A private residence located at 1301 N. Mojave Road, at the corner of Mojave Road and E. Searles Avenue, had three exterior cameras located on the home. Detective Eddington obtained the footage from cameras #2, #4, and #5, which were the exterior cameras, of the actions captured on July 11, 2018, from 1520 to 1530 hours based on the system's time stamp. Note: The time stamp of the residential system was not accurate, and did not coincide with the real time the actions captured on video occurred.

The video captured a black Ford Expedition with chrome rims and chrome around the taillights which matched the vehicle driven by Nunez. The driver of the vehicle appeared to be a Hispanic male, with short dark hair, and wore a black shirt. The male matched Nunez' description. The vehicle traveled east on E. Searles Avenue, then turned south (right) on Mojave Road.

Las Dunas Auto Sales – 1250 N. Eastern Avenue

Detective Eddington canvassed the surrounding neighborhoods and businesses near the homicide scene at the car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue. Las Dunas Auto Sales located at 1250 N. Eastern Avenue had several cameras at different viewing angles. The owner, Hiram Martinez (██████████), provided video footage to LVMPD. The video footage captured at that location depicted the following:

One of the cameras, designated as Camera 1, faced Eastern Avenue and captured a black Ford Expedition with chrome rims and chrome around the taillights, which matched the vehicle driven by Nunez. The vehicle traveled north on Eastern Avenue toward E. Searles Avenue. The time stamp via the internal system of the recorder showed this occurred on 07-11-18 at 07:11:00 hrs.

A second camera, designated as Camera 8, faced north to E. Searles Avenue and captured the car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue in the background. Based on the time stamp via the internal system of the recorder, on 07-11-18 at 07:11:10 hours, a black Ford Expedition traveling north on Eastern Avenue pulled into the car wash and entered one of the wash bays. At 07:13:43 hours, a male in a white shirt exited the wash bay and moved around the front of the vehicle before disappearing back into the wash bay. At 07:16:07 hours, a male in dark clothing exited the wash bay and moved around the front of the vehicle for a moment before returning inside the bay. Both of the males were visible in and out of the camera view between 07:18 and 07:20 hours. At time stamp 07:20:04 hours, the vehicle pulled out of the bay, then backed up into a different bay, one stall to the south.

At 07:21:01 hours, a male walked west on E. Searles Avenue and into camera view. At 07:21:57 hours, the male reached the driveway for the car wash, proceeded onto the property, and went directly to the bay where the Ford Expedition was parked. At 07:22:16 hours, the male entered the car wash bay with the Ford Expedition. At 07:23:10 hours, the Ford Expedition pulled out of the car wash bay and turned east (left) onto E. Searles Avenue.

Self-service Car Wash – 1402 N. Eastern Avenue

Detective Eddington contacted the manager of the self-service car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue, Yadira Espinosa [REDACTED], and was provided the video surveillance from the business. The camera system had an internal time stamp automatically generated for all of their cameras. The time stamp was one hour behind actual time. There were multiple cameras located within the car wash that captured portions of the event. There were a total of five connected wash bays; two were to the south, there was an enclosed storage area, then three bays to the north. For purposes of this summary, the bays will be referred to as #1 through #5, with #1 being the farthest north and #5 being the farthest south, nearest E. Searles Avenue.

The following is a list of cameras at the car wash that captured footage related to the homicide and their respective viewing angles at the time of the incident:

- Camera 2: Captured the inside of wash bay #3 and the driveway into the car wash from Eastern.
- Camera 5: Video was distorted, but captured a portion of the front of the car wash across bays #3 and #4.
- Camera 8: Faced the back of the car wash toward the vacuums and a portion of E. Searles Avenue.
- Camera 11: Located at the back of the property near the vacuums, but faced west. The camera captured bays #1, #2, and #3, as well as Eastern Avenue.
- Camera 14: Located at the front of the car wash and looked across the front of the wash bays from north to south.

- Camera 16: Pointed down toward the change machine located at the front of the car wash. The change machine was located next to bay #3.

The cameras had automatic time stamps. The time stamps were an hour behind actual time.

Collectively, the cameras depicted the following:

On 07-11-18, Wednesday at 06:12:03 hours, a black Ford Expedition entered the property from Eastern Avenue. The Ford Expedition pulled into wash bay #2 and was occupied two times. The driver, Rene Nunez, wore a black shirt and shorts, and the passenger, Thomas Romero, wore a baseball style cap, white shirt, and dark shorts. Both Romero and Nunez exited the vehicle and began to wash it.

At 06:20:58 hours, Nunez entered the driver side of the vehicle and drove it out of wash bay #2. Nunez then reversed the vehicle and backed into wash bay #3. While Nunez backed up the vehicle, Romero walked into bay #3 and moved to the control panel where it appeared he put money into it. At 06:21:40 hours, Nunez exited the vehicle and moved around the back to join Romero. Romero remained near the control panel at the back passenger side of the vehicle as Nunez walked around the vehicle and used the hose to spray down the Ford Expedition.

At 06:22:54 hours, Fidel Miranda entered Camera 8 view from E. Searles Avenue. He walked to bay #3 and looked at Nunez, who was at the front driver side of the Expedition. Nunez did not stop washing the vehicle. Miranda moved along the side of the vehicle to Romero. Romero appeared to acknowledge Miranda as Romero gave a head nod toward him. Miranda continued walking and produced a black handgun. At 06:23:25 hours, while holding the handgun with his right hand, Miranda fired multiple times at Romero at close range. Romero immediately fell to the ground. Nunez had not stopped spraying the vehicle, however, did appear to watch Miranda and Romero through the windows. After the shots were fired, Nunez pulled a gun from his waistband, but did not appear startled or surprised. Nunez did not make any motions to defend Romero or himself.

Miranda calmly walked away from Romero, toward the passenger door of the Ford Expedition. Nunez attempted to open the driver door, but it appeared locked. Nunez and Miranda appeared to be speaking as Nunez was searching for the keys. Miranda walked in a northwest direction out of the bay, toward Eastern Avenue, as Nunez followed to the corner of the wash bay. As Miranda was halfway past bay #2, Nunez appeared to be speaking to him and gave a motion with his arm similar to calling him back. Miranda turned and walked back to bay #3 where Nunez was standing.

At 06:23:52 hours, Miranda and Nunez opened the front (driver and passenger) doors of the Ford Expedition. As Nunez entered the vehicle, he pointed toward the rear of the vehicle. Miranda turned and walked toward the back of the vehicle and searched Romero who was still on the ground. Miranda then walked back to and entered the vehicle. At 06:24:10 hours, the Ford Expedition pulled out of the bay and exited the car wash. Romero was seen lying on his back near the control panel of bay #3. At 06:24:21 hours, the Ford Expedition left the car wash, headed east on E. Searles Avenue.

Senator Richard Bryan Senior Apartments – 2651 E. Searles Avenue

Detective Hodson made contact with management of the Senator Richard Bryan Senior Apartments located at 2651 E. Searles Avenue. The complex had a security camera system which was functional. Two of the recorded camera views were provided to Detective Hodson.

The cameras depicted the following:

One of the cameras, designated as Camera 4, faced north and captured the front gate of the complex which faced E. Searles Avenue. The time stamp on the video was set by the system the complex used. Based on the time stamp, on 07-11-18 at 07:22:55 hours, a light colored Cadillac CTS sedan pulled up to the main vehicle entry gate. The driver stepped out of the vehicle to use the gate control, which immediately opened the gate. The driver returned to the vehicle, entered the complex, and turned to the right, leaving Camera 4's view.

The second camera, designated as Camera 3, faced a parking lot area. The Cadillac entered the camera view at the time stamp of 07:23:24 hours, when it drove through the lot. On Camera 4, at 07:31:33 hours, a black female, wearing an orange shirt (documented because of the uniqueness of the shirt and walker also seen on the Las Dunas Auto Sales video) and who used a walker, came into view. The woman walked west toward the main gate. At 07:31:48 hours, a male appeared on the left side of the screen. The male appeared to be the same male who stepped out of the Cadillac. He used the pedestrian gate to exit the complex, and headed to E. Searles Avenue where he made a right turn to walk east. At 07:32:12 hours, the female reached the same pedestrian gate, however, changed course and used the open vehicle gate to exit the complex, then headed east. The male exited camera view at 07:32:34 hours, and the female exited camera view at 07:33:17 hours.

2820 E. Searles Avenue

Detective Eddington canvassed the surrounding neighborhoods and businesses near the homicide scene at the car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue. A private residence located at 2820 E. Searles Avenue, on E. Searles Avenue near Mojave Road, had exterior cameras on the home. The homeowner, Jorge Sagastume [REDACTED], provided video footage to LVMPD. The captured footage had a self-generated time stamp.

At time stamp of 07-11-2018, Wednesday at 07:24:08, the cameras captured a black Ford Expedition, occupied by a driver and front passenger, travel east on E. Searles Avenue toward Mojave Road. The passenger was seen with their window down and right arm hanging out the window.

Circle K – 1301 N. Eastern Avenue

Video footage was obtained from the Circle K located at 1301 N. Eastern Avenue [REDACTED] which was directly across the street from the car wash located at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue. The video system had an internal time stamp displayed on the bottom of the player. None of the cameras located at this business were set up to capture views across the street, therefore, nothing from the homicide was captured. What the video did show was employees

looking out the front doors of the business, as well as an employee from the AutoZone located at 1351 N. Eastern Avenue run across the street. Those actions occurred at time stamp 07-11-2018 07:22:48.

Family Justice Center – 861 N. Mojave Road

Detectives from the LVMPD Computer Forensics Lab responded to The Family Justice Center where they obtained video surveillance footage. The business was located at 861 N. Mojave Road and possibly captured the direction of travel the suspects fled after the shooting at the car wash. However, upon attempting to view the footage, due to the camera view, detectives were unable to verify if the vehicle was seen.

Video – CFL School

Detectives from the LVMPD Computer Forensics Lab responded to Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School, where they obtained video surveillance footage. The school was located at 1776 E. Ogden Avenue and possibly captured the officer involved shooting. However, upon attempting to view the footage, due to the camera view, detectives were unable to verify if the vehicle was seen.

Nevada Express – 199 N. Eastern Avenue

Detectives from the LVMPD Computer Forensics Lab responded to Nevada Express where they obtained video surveillance footage. Nevada Express was located at 199 N. Eastern Avenue, at the corner of Eastern Avenue and Ogden Avenue. The business had exterior cameras, with an embedded time stamp on the camera system that was one hour behind actual time. Exterior Camera 1 showed the intersection of Eastern Avenue and Ogden Avenue looking northeast. At time stamp 07-11-2018 Wednesday, 08:34:13, an LVMPD vehicle with emergency lights activated was traveling south on Eastern Avenue. As the LVMPD vehicle entered the intersection, it appeared to slow down and exited out of view. At 08:34:26, a black Ford Expedition made a westbound turn on Ogden Avenue from northbound Eastern Avenue. It appeared to possibly have a flat front driver side tire. The vehicle was immediately followed by four marked LVMPD patrol vehicles, all with emergency lights activated, a fifth marked LVMPD patrol vehicle trailed slightly behind them. All of the vehicles continued west on Ogden Avenue.

Las Vegas Shuttle Corporation – 1404 N. Eastern Avenue

Detectives from the LVMPD Computer Forensics Lab responded to Las Vegas Shuttle Corporation where they obtained video surveillance footage. The business was located at 1404 N. Eastern Avenue, which was to the north of the car was at 1402 N. Eastern Avenue. The video had an embedded time and date stamp for the system. One of the exterior cameras, Camera 14, faced east along the front of the business and partially captured wash bays #1, #2, and #3 at the car wash.

The surveillance camera footage depicted the following.

At time and date stamp 07-11-2018 Wednesday 07:15:01, Thomas Romero and Rene Nunez were in car wash bay #2 with a black Ford Expedition. At 07:19:40, Romero walked to wash bay #3 and the Expedition was moved to the same wash bay. Due to the angle of the camera, the Ford Expedition moved on the side not in camera view. Nunez washed the vehicle and Romero stepped to the right of wash bay #3, just out of camera view. At 07:21:58, Fidel Miranda appeared from the passenger side of the Ford Expedition, raised his right arm, and stepped slightly out of camera view, to where Romero had last been seen. Miranda then turned and walked back into the wash bay. Miranda returned back into view at 07:22:14 as he appeared to walk away from the car wash toward Eastern Avenue. He then turned and walked back into the wash bay. At 07:22:27, Miranda reappeared in a hurried fashion as he moved back out of the wash bay and off screen to the right, then returned into the wash bay. At 07:22:37, the Ford Expedition exited the wash bay.

Arco AM/PM – 2320 Fremont Street

Detectives from the LVMPD Computer Forensics Lab responded to the Arco AM/PM located at 2320 Fremont Street and obtained video surveillance footage. This Arco AM/PM was located at an intersection known as “Five Points,” where Charleston Boulevard, Fremont Street, and Eastern all came together. There were several outdoor cameras, and the captured footage was provided to detectives. The videos had an embedded time and date stamp from the system. The time and date stamp on the system showed 2018-7-11 at 09:33:39 when a black Ford Expedition was traveling west on Charleston Boulevard and four marked police vehicles with emergency lights activated followed. At 09:33:48, patrons in the parking lot who were watching the vehicles as they passed, jumped and immediately ran from the open area.

On July 12, 2018, at approximately 0900 hours, under Clark County Office of the Coroner/Medical Examiner (CCOCME) case 18-07131, an autopsy was performed on the body of Thomas Romero Jr. at the CCOCME by Doctor AbuBakr Marzouk.

Involved Officers

Officer William Umana

Per LVMPD Policy 6/002.04, Post Use of Force Procedures, an involved officer may provide a recorded statement to FIT investigators. If given, involved officer statements are taken at least 48 hours after the incident unless waived by the involved officer.

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1519 hours, Lieutenant Lloyd contacted Officer Umana to see if he would provide a voluntary statement to FIT investigators; Officer Umana declined.

Officer Paul Solomon

Per LVMPD Policy 6/002.04, Post Use of Force Procedures, an involved officer may provide a recorded statement to FIT investigators. If given, involved officer statements are taken at least 48 hours after the incident unless waived by the involved officer.

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1530 hours, Lieutenant Lloyd contacted Officer Solomon to see if he would provide a voluntary statement to FIT investigators; Officer Solomon declined.

Victim Officers

Sergeant Jason Harries

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1343 hours, Detective Ubbens conducted an audio recorded interview with Sergeant Harries at 1776 E. Ogden Avenue. Also present for the interview was LVPMSA representative Russell Wood. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Sergeant Harries heard a radio broadcast of a male with a gunshot wound to the chest at the intersection of E. Searles Avenue and Eastern Avenue. Following Supervisors Tactic for Armed Subject Response (STAR) Protocol, Sergeant Harries assigned himself to the shooting call. While on his way to the call, a traffic unit located a possible suspect vehicle at E. Searles Avenue and Las Vegas Boulevard. Sergeant Harries arrived at the location where the possible suspect vehicle had been stopped. When he arrived, Sergeant Harries noticed Sergeant Kobry's, along with several other officers, already on scene with the possible suspect vehicle, so he went to the shooting scene.

When Sergeant Harries arrived at the car wash, medical personnel were leaving with the victim (Thomas Romero). Sergeant Harries observed blood and several casings at the scene. While at the scene Sergeant Harries heard a detective broadcast on the radio a possible suspect vehicle had been located. Sergeant Harries began monitoring the radio and heard Officer Umana announce he was in pursuit of the vehicle. Shortly after the pursuit was initiated, Sergeant Harries heard an officer broadcast on the radio shots fired.

Sergeant Harries drove southbound on Eastern Avenue towards the pursuit while the vehicles involved in the pursuit traveled northbound on Eastern Avenue. He saw the suspect vehicle, pursued by a patrol vehicle, pass him going northbound. When the suspect vehicle passed, he saw the passenger in the suspect vehicle (Fidel Miranda) lean out of the window and look back towards the pursuing officers. Sergeant Harries made a U-turn and briefly became the primary vehicle in the pursuit. He moved over to allow a patrol officer to take over the primary pursuit position.

Sergeant Harries heard gunshots and did not know if the suspects were engaging the officers or if officers were engaging the suspects. Sergeant Harries saw the vehicle crash, and the driver (Rene Nunez) run from the vehicle. While Nunez ran from the vehicle, Sergeant Harries saw Officer Umana engage Miranda. Sergeant Harries cut off Nunez' eastbound escape route, causing him to run up the stairs into the school (Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School) courtyard. Sergeant Harries refocused his attention to the vehicle and saw Miranda move into the driver seat. Miranda reversed his vehicle towards the area where Officer Umana was located, then drive forward and crashed into the wall. Sergeant Harries requested the Air Unit locate Nunez while he and an arrest team formulated a plan to take Miranda into custody.

Sergeant Harries did not see any officers fire their weapons other than Officer Umana, however, he did hear a shotgun discharge.

Sergeant Bryan Kobry's

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1433 hours, Detective Ubbens conducted an audio recorded interview with Sergeant Kobry's at 1776 E. Ogden Avenue. Also present for the interview was LVPMSA representative Russell Wood. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Sergeant Kobrys responded to the scene of the shooting at E. Searles Avenue and Eastern Avenue. It was decided that Sergeant Harries, who was also on scene, would take control of the scene to leave Sergeant Kolbrys available for additional calls within the area command.

A possible suspect vehicle from the shooting was described as a full-sized, dark sport utility vehicle (SUV) with large tires and metallic or chrome taillights. Less than two hours after the shooting, a patrol detective broadcast a pursuit of a vehicle that matched the description of the suspect vehicle related to the shooting. Sergeant Kobrys acknowledged and approved the pursuit. During the pursuit, he heard an officer broadcast the occupants of the vehicle were shooting at officers.

Sergeant Kobrys heard the vehicle was in the area of Mojave Road and Charleston Boulevard and coming in his direction. Knowing the suspect(s) had previously shot at officers, Sergeant Kobrys felt a precision intervention technique (PIT) could be utilized to end the pursuit. When the vehicle passed him, Sergeant Kobrys had a small opportunity to attempt a PIT. When he got behind the vehicle traveling northbound on Eastern Avenue from Charleston Boulevard, Sergeant Kobrys heard a gunshot and quickly steered left to be off center of the suspect vehicle. Sergeant Kobrys accelerated to close distance between his vehicle and the suspect vehicle to attempt his PIT, when he saw the passenger (Fidel Miranda) fire through the back window of the SUV causing the rear window to shatter. Miranda turned, leaned over his left shoulder, and shot at Sergeant Kobrys. Sergeant Kobrys' patrol vehicle struck the center median causing a deflated tire.

Sergeant Kobrys turned off Eastern Avenue onto Isabella Avenue. He saw the suspect vehicle turn onto the next street paralleling Isabella Avenue. At 21st Street and Isabella Avenue, Sergeant Kobrys exited his vehicle to assess the damage. While assessing the damage to his vehicle, Sergeant Kobrys heard the suspect vehicle crash. Sergeant Kobrys got back into his vehicle and proceeded towards the pursuit termination point.

When Sergeant Kobrys arrived at the suspect vehicle, he saw multiple officers around the vehicle. Knowing a suspect had fled, Sergeant Kobrys proceeded west to take a perimeter position. While on the perimeter, he saw a suspect (Rene Nunez) lying in the courtyard of a school (Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School). Sergeant Kobrys assisted K-9 and other officers with taking Nunez into custody.

Sergeant Kobrys believed his vehicle was struck four times by gunfire during the pursuit. He believed the occupants of the suspect vehicle, Nunez and Miranda, were trying to kill him while they were shooting at him. Sergeant Kobrys felt his life, the lives of pedestrians, and other drivers in the area were in danger while shots were being fired from the suspect vehicle.

Officer James Parker

On July 11, 2018 at approximately 1518 hours, Detective Hodson conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Parker at LVMPD headquarters, 400 S. Martin Luther King Boulevard. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative Myron Hamm. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Officer Parker had just cleared from the City of Las Vegas Detention Center, located at 3300 E. Stewart Avenue, near Stewart Avenue and Mojave Road, when he heard the radio broadcast from Officer Umana advising he was in pursuit of a vehicle in which the occupant(s) had shot at him while traveling south on Mojave Road from Washington Boulevard. Officer Parker knew Officer Umana and the suspects would intersect with him, so he went to Mojave Road and Bonanza Road and stayed in the middle of the intersection. The suspect vehicle traveled past Officer Parker and continued south. As the suspect vehicle traveled past Officer Parked the driver (Rene Nunez) of the vehicle looked at him, pointed a gun with his right hand which was stretched across his body, and fired rounds at Officer Parker.

Officer Parker immediately broadcast over the radio, "They're shooting at me." He then turned his vehicle around and joined the pursuit with Officer Umana. During the vehicle pursuit, Officer Parker observed the passenger (Fidel Miranda) hang his arm out of the window and fire at officers. As the pursuit continued, Nunez turned north on Eastern Avenue from Charleston Boulevard. As Nunez made the northbound turn, Miranda leaned his entire upper body out of the window and faced the officers as he fired. Officer Parker believed his life and the lives of other officers were in danger, but continued to pursue.

When the Air Unit (AIR3) arrived, Officer Parker announced on the radio to let the Air Unit call the pursuit, so officers could back away from the suspect vehicle for safety. The suspect vehicle jumped a median and the front driver side tire blew out, however, Nunez and Miranda continued to flee. Nunez eventually lost control of the vehicle and crashed into the side of Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School. Nunez exited the vehicle and ran up a staircase that led to the school. Miranda jumped into the driver seat, and Officer Parker prepared to continue to pursue the vehicle. As Officer Parker put his patrol vehicle into reverse, he heard more gunfire and observed Officer Umana shooting. Miranda put the vehicle back in drive and again crashed into the wall of the school. Officer Parker maintained cover on Nunez and Miranda as they were taken into custody by responding units.

Officer Michael Roe

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1531 hours, Detective Mendoza conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Roe at LVMPD headquarters, 400 S. Martin Luther King Boulevard. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative John Abel. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 0800 hours, Officer Roe was conducting routine patrol in the Downtown area with Officer Tyler Georgi. Officer Roe was notified over a radio broadcast that officers were looking for a vehicle that was involved in a shooting earlier in the day. As Officer Roe was in the area of Foremaster Lane and Bruce Street, he heard Detective Ramone Brown broadcast over the radio that he located the vehicle in the area of Constantine Avenue and Washington Boulevard.

Officer Roe assigned himself to the call and activated his body worn camera, emergency lights, and siren. Officers Roe and Georgi responded to the area of Owens Avenue and Mojave Road. Officer Roe heard a radio transmission from Sergeant Kobry's granting permission to pursue the

vehicle if it was located. As Officer Roe caught up to the pursuing officers on Mojave Road, Officer Parker broadcast he was being shot at by the suspects.

Officer Roe drove westbound on Stewart Avenue in an attempt to intercept the suspect vehicle. Once Officers Roe and Georgi arrived at Eastern Avenue, Officer Roe headed southbound and informed Officer Georgi that he intended to intentionally ram the suspect vehicle if he could. As Officer Roe saw the suspect vehicle coming toward them, he attempted to stop the vehicle, but the driver of the suspect vehicle (Rene Nunez) avoided the collision.

Officer Roe allowed the pursuing officers to pass him and he continued to drive westbound on Ogden Avenue. As Officers Roe and Georgi arrived on the north side of Hollingsworth Elementary School, he saw Nunez exit the vehicle and run up the stairs. Officer Roe saw Officer Umana engage the suspect vehicle with gunfire. Officer Roe saw the second suspect (Fidel Miranda), who was originally in the passenger seat, attempt to get in the driver seat. Officer Roe believed he saw Miranda fire rounds in his direction while Miranda continued to move in the vehicle.

Miranda placed the car in reverse and Officer Roe was going to ram the suspect vehicle to avoid another pursuit. Officer Roe did not ram the vehicle, and he exited his patrol vehicle and took cover. Officer Roe issued verbal commands to everyone and warned of any crossfire issues. Officer Roe responded to Officer Umana's location and issued verbal commands to Miranda to exit the vehicle. Officers approached the vehicle and took Miranda into custody and secured him in handcuffs.

Officer Mike Enrique

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1553 hours, Detective Hodson conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Enrique at 1776 E. Ogden Avenue. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative Steve Grammas. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Officer Enrique was working as part of a two-man patrol unit and had been assigned to a call when he heard the radio traffic reference Officer Umana's vehicle stop turning into a pursuit. Officer Enrique knew the stop was in reference to a shooting from earlier in the day. Officer Enrique diverted from the call he had been assigned and headed toward the pursuit. He observed the suspect vehicle and joined the pursuit in the area of Charleston Boulevard and Mojave Road. The suspect vehicle turned at Charleston Boulevard and Eastern Avenue, and at that point Officer Enrique observed the passenger (Fidel Miranda) lean his upper body out of the window and fire rounds toward officers. Officer Enrique was fearful officers or the many citizens in the area were going to be shot.

Officer Enrique continued to follow the suspect vehicle as it turned west on Ogden Avenue. At Ogden Avenue and 18th Street, the driver of the vehicle (Rene Nunez) jumped out of the moving car, which then struck a wall. Nunez ran up a flight of stairs and into a school (Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School) courtyard. Officer Enrique observed the vehicle move backwards, and the passenger (Fidel Miranda) had moved to the driver seat. Officer Enrique observed Officer Umana fire at the vehicle as it moved in reverse.

Officer Enrique held his position and covered the vehicle until a group moved up to take Miranda into custody.

Officer Tyler Georgi

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1608 hours, Detective Mendoza conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Georgi at LVMPD headquarters, 400 S. Martin Luther King Boulevard. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative Myron Hamm. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1736 hrs, Officer Georgi learned about a call of a subject being shot in the chest. The information revealed that two suspects (Rene Nunez and Fidel Miranda) fled the area in a black SUV with big rims. Later in the day officers broadcast they had possibly located the suspect vehicle. Officers initially lost visual of the vehicle, but located again and were involved in a vehicle pursuit. Officer Georgi, along with his field training officer, Officer Roe, responded to the area of the pursuit. As they were heading southbound on an unknown street, the suspect vehicle headed northbound directly towards them.

Officer Georgi stated the suspect vehicle almost collided into their patrol vehicle, and he feared for his life, his partner's life, as well as the lives of other citizens. As Officer Roe allowed the pursuing officers to continue northbound, they again followed the other patrol vehicles to the area of Ogden Avenue and Bruce Street. As Officer Georgi arrived at the termination point with Officer Roe, he saw Nunez run from the vehicle. Officer Georgi also heard shots being fired as he exited his patrol vehicle. As Officer Georgi exited the patrol vehicle, he saw an officer shooting a handgun (Officer Umana) and another officer shooting a shotgun (Officer Solomon) toward the suspect vehicle. Officer Georgi also saw the suspect vehicle move backwards while the shooting took place. Officer Georgi said although he pulled his firearm out when he exited the patrol vehicle, he did not fire his weapon during the incident.

Witnesses

Detective Ramone Brown

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1415 hours, Detective Alsup conducted an audio recorded interview with Detective Brown in the area of Ogden Avenue and Bruce Street. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative Myron Hamm. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Detective Brown and his squad responded to a shooting in the area of 1402 N. Eastern Avenue on July 11, 2018. During the course of the investigation detectives identified a black Ford Expedition as the suspect vehicle in the shooting. The Ford Expedition was described as a late 1990s or early 2000 model, with 22" chrome wheels, clear taillights, and no license plate. The suspects were described as Hispanic male adults, both heavysset, wearing white t-shirts.

Detective Brown was attempting to locate the vehicle in the area of Constantine Avenue and 28th Street when he observed a dark SUV traveling towards him. As the vehicle neared,

Detective Brown realized the vehicle was a black Ford Expedition with Hispanic males in the driver and passenger seats. Detective Brown noticed large chrome rims, clear taillights, and no license plate as the vehicle passed him.

Detective Brown made a U-turn and notified Dispatch he was following the vehicle. The Ford Expedition made turned north (left) on 29th Street, east (right) on Washington Avenue, then north (left) on Mojave Road. After turning onto Mojave Road, Detective Brown observed a marked police vehicle headed south on Mojave Road. Detective Brown pulled over so the marked unit could take the primary position. The driver of the Ford Expedition made a U-turn to head south on Mojave Road in front of the marked police vehicle and accelerated at a high rate of speed. Detective Brown lost visual of the Ford Expedition and the marked police vehicle shortly after passing through the intersection of Washington Avenue and Mojave Road.

Detective Brown responded to the termination point of the pursuit and observed the same black Ford Expedition crashed into a wall. According to Detective Brown, the Hispanic male who was handcuffed on the sidewalk (Fidel Miranda) appeared to be the one he observed in the passenger seat of the Ford Expedition when he observed it on Constantine Avenue.

K-9 Officer James Ledogar

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1435 hours, Detective Hodson conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Ledogar at LVMPD headquarters, 400 S. Martin Luther King Boulevard. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative John Abel. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Officer Ledogar responded to the radio broadcast of a vehicle pursuit of a shooting suspect. When Officer Ledogar switched radio channels to monitor the pursuit, he heard the broadcasts of the suspects firing at the pursuing officers. Knowing that most vehicle pursuits end with a suspect crashing or running from their vehicle, he immediately responded in the direction of the pursuit.

Officer Ledogar arrived in the area of Bruce Street and Ogden Avenue shortly after the vehicle had crashed and the driver (Rene Nunez) had fled onto Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School property. Officer Ledogar parked away from the suspect vehicle location, got his dog, and made contact with officers assembling near him. Officer Ledogar had a team of responding officers join him and used a vehicle for cover as they moved toward the accident location. He heard radio traffic being broadcast about Nunez, and the Air Unit was giving updated information on Nunez' location. Officer Ledogar was unaware Miranda was still inside of the vehicle.

As Officer Ledogar reached the officers positioned near the stairwell, he learned Miranda was still inside the vehicle. Officer Ledogar saw Miranda and believed he was deceased inside of the vehicle based on the way he looked. With his belief Miranda was deceased, and possibly an armed suspect on school property where kids were, Officer Ledogar made the decision to move up onto the school property with a group of officers. As Officer Ledogar reached the top of the stairs, Nunez was lying prone at the end of a walkway. Officer Ledogar released his dog as a distraction, which engaged Nunez, as the group of officers moved forward and took Nunez into custody.

Officer Brian Steelsmith

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1500 hours, Detective Mendoza conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Steelsmith at LVMPD headquarters, 400 S. Martin Luther King Boulevard. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative John Abel. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Officer Steelsmith was patrolling the northeast area of town when he heard DTAC officers had located a vehicle that was possibly involved in a shooting. Officer Steelsmith was notified the suspects in the vehicle (Rene Nunez and Fidel Miranda) were shooting at DTAC officers. Officer Steelsmith and his partner responded to the area to assist the officers. Officer Steelsmith parked his patrol vehicle on Bruce Street and Ogden Avenue and took cover behind a building as instructed by other patrol units. Officer Steelsmith stated Nunez and Miranda were taken into custody and medical personnel had arrived on scene to provide medical treatment. Officer Steelsmith stated he entered the ambulance with Nunez and medical personnel and escorted them to UMC, while his partner followed the ambulance in his patrol vehicle.

While Officer Steelsmith had his BWC activated, he heard Nunez utter comments to medical staff that Miranda was going to kill his (Nunez') family. Once everyone arrived at UMC, Nunez stated to medical staff his name was Rene Nunez and his date of birth was 05/11/88. Once Officer Steelsmith entered UMC, he deactivated his BWC. Officer Steelsmith stayed with Nunez while he was being treated at UMC trauma. Officer Steelsmith continued to listen to Nunez while Nunez talked. Nunez also stated Miranda's brother, Hector Miranda, was going to kill his (Nunez') family. Officer Steelsmith gave this information to detectives that also responded to the hospital.

Officer Maria Fulwiler

On July 11, 2018, at approximately 1515 hours, Detective Mendoza conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Fulwiler at LVMPD headquarters, 400 S. Martin Luther King Boulevard. Also present for the interview was LVPPA representative John Abel. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Officer Fulwiler was transporting prisoners to the Clark County Detention Center (CCDC) when she was notified by radio there was a subject who had been shot in the area of Eastern Avenue and E. Searles Avenue. As Officer Fulwiler finished an arrest at CCDC, she monitored her radio and heard officers were searching for a Ford Expedition SUV, driven by a Hispanic male wearing a tank top. Officer Fulwiler stated she did not respond as there were numerous officers already assigned to the area.

As Officer Fulwiler continued to patrol the DTAC area, she heard several officers announce on the radio that shots were being fired from a vehicle. The suspect vehicle matched the description of the vehicle officers were trying to locate earlier in the day. Officer Fulwiler activated her BWC, as well as her emergency lights and sirens, and drove to the area of Bruce Street and Ogden Avenue, and assisted other patrol officers with the incident. She parked her patrol vehicle on the east side of Howard Hollingsworth Elementary School, located at 1776 E. Ogden Avenue. Officer

Fulwiler retrieved her shotgun from her patrol vehicle and met with other assisting officers. Officer Fulwiler stated the officers she met with were Officers Ledogar, Umana, and Freeman. All officers made their way to the west side of the school. They formed an arrest team in order to take one of the suspects (Rene Nunez) who had ran from the vehicle and onto the school property into custody. Information was received that children were still inside of the school.

As the arrest team made their way up a stairwell, Nunez was located on the landing. Officer Fulwiler stated Officer Ledogar released his K-9 dog, who then apprehended Nunez. Officer Fulwiler and the team approached Nunez and she handcuffed him without further incident. While Nunez was handcuffed, Officer Fulwiler heard him say Cabeson (Fidel Miranda) was the subject who shot him. Nunez repeated several times that Cabeson was the one who shot him in the head. Nunez also stated he wanted to give himself up, Miranda would not let him. Officer Fulwiler observed a possible graze wound to Nunez' left ear, and also dog bites to his head and arm area.

Officer Fulwiler said while she conducted a pat down on Nunez for weapons after he was handcuffed, she located a holster on his right side, but no firearm was located.

Hector Miranda Jr.

On July 16, 2018, at approximately 1303 hours, Detective Penny conducted an audio recorded interview with Hector Miranda at the Nevada DPS Parole and Probation office, 215 E. Bonanza Road. Also present for the interview was Detective Hodson. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Hector Miranda was interviewed to learn more about his brother, Fidel Miranda, and Rene Nunez. Hector stated Nunez went by the name of Creeper. Hector was informed Nunez had stated he only helped Miranda because Miranda stated Hector would kill Nunez' family if he didn't help him escape. Hector denied the claims by Nunez and stated he only knows of Nunez' sister, who he had met once. Hector stated he never received a phone call from Miranda telling him to kill Nunez' family.

Hector stated Miranda had stayed the night at their home and woke up early Wednesday (July 11, 2018) morning and left with Nunez. Hector stated his mother, Maria, saw Miranda leave and get picked up by Nunez. Hector was questioned by detectives about text messages sent from Miranda to him, which he originally denied knowledge of. One of the messages Miranda sent Hector said, "Tommy is history." Miranda sent another message to Hector which said to "stash your metal." Hector then responded back to Miranda, "Aight." Initially, Hector denied reading or responding to any of those messages, but later admitted to reading and sending them. Hector talked about a phone call to Miranda after those messages were sent. He stated that during the phone call he heard Nunez in the background giving instructions to Miranda on where to go and what to do.

Hector stated Nunez had stayed with them in the past and was a good person. He talked about guns Nunez had, which he had brought to the home. Hector specifically talked about a 9MM handgun with a black lower and chrome upper frame, which Nunez had brought to the home a couple of weeks before the shooting. Hector stated he knew his brother had an all-black .45

caliber handgun, which he had shown him. Hector denied to detectives ever touching one of the guns or placing a gun in the truck like Miranda had asked him to do via text message.

Hector stated he, Miranda, and Nunez knew each other, and were associated through FTC (Fuck the Cops) and the neighborhood.

Maria Eugenia Miranda

On July 16, 2018, at approximately 1354 hours, Detective Hodson conducted an audio recorded interview with Maria Miranda at the Nevada DPS Parole and Probation office, 215 E. Bonanza Road. Also present for the interview was Detective Penny. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

On July 11, 2018, Maria had woken up early for an appointment. At around 0640 or 0650 hours, she heard (Fidel) Miranda's cell phone ring. Maria knew Miranda was speaking to Nunez by the sound of his voice, although she didn't know what they were talking about because they were speaking in English. Maria knew the sound of Nunez' voice, as he used to stay at Maria's residence, though she had kicked him out prior to the incident. Maria did not like Nunez and blamed him for Miranda's issues. After the phone call, Miranda went into the bedroom, put on a t-shirt, and walked out the door. Maria saw him out in front of the residence with Nunez. She didn't see where they went or how they left, but both of them were gone quickly.

Maria stated she knew that Nunez had been driving a black truck style vehicle with tall rims. Maria told detectives Nunez was the one that pulled Miranda into the streets, and that is why she would not allow him in her home. Miranda called Maria the morning of July 11, 2018, and asked her for help, and said he needed money. She did not know where to send the money or how to help, and the call disconnected before she could find out more information. Maria received another call from Miranda, who apologized to her for his actions and begged her to forgive him, before the call was disconnected.

Jason Raphiel

On July 18, 2018, at approximately 1456 hours, Detective Penny conducted an audio recorded interview with Jason Raphiel at 3508 Hickey Avenue. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Raphiel was interviewed in reference to North Las Vegas Police Department report number 1805210009532 taken for grand larceny auto and grand larceny gun. Raphiel was listed as a victim, along with Jose Saldivar-Soto. The location of the theft was identified as 3540 E. Lake Mead Boulevard in North Las Vegas. In the narrative of the report, the theft suspect was identified as "Rene," AKA Creeper.

Raphiel stated he saw the news in reference to the murder and OIS that occurred July 11, 2018, and recognized his stolen Ford Expedition and the suspect, Rene Nunez, as the person who stole his vehicle. Raphiel has known Nunez since high school and had recently started hanging out with him. On May 20, 2018, the date of the theft, Raphiel, Nunez and another friend, Rudy

Guiton, went to the Golden Market convenience store, adjacent to the Sinclair gas station, located at 3585 N. Lamb Boulevard to gamble.

While inside the business, Guiton asked Raphiel for the keys to the Ford Expedition, so he could get more money. Raphiel stated the keys were in the vehicle and Guiton left the store. When Guiton came back into the building, Nunez went outside, got into the vehicle, and stole it. Raphiel stated he had left his Taurus handgun, along with two magazines, in the vehicle near the center console.

Raphiel stated he told his father-in-law, Jose Saldivar-Soto, about the theft since he was the legal owner of the vehicle. Saldivar-Soto went to the North Las Vegas Police Department on May 21, 2018, and reported the theft. Raphiel stated there may have been a language barrier between his father-in-law and the records clerk, which caused confusion about the location of the theft. Raphiel amended the report on June 06, 2018, with his stolen firearm information.

Raphiel stated he saw Nunez a couple of times after the vehicle theft driving the Ford Expedition. The vehicle had different rims on it, but Raphiel recognized the taillights he had installed. At one point, Raphiel saw Nunez driving the Ford Expedition and attempted to stop him, but Nunez fled in the vehicle.

Raphiel stated Nunez did not have permission to take his vehicle or firearm. Nunez made no attempts to return the vehicle to Raphiel during the time it was stolen.

Flor Reyes

On July 30, 2018, at approximately 1023 hours, Detective Leavitt conducted an audio recorded interview with Flor Reyes at 2501 N. Green Valley Parkway, #16. Also present for the interview was Detective Penny. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

On July 11, 2018, Reyes witnessed part of the vehicle pursuit between officers and the suspects (Rene Nunez and Fidel Miranda) and Miranda shooting at officers, but was not contacted by detectives. She reached out to LVMPD through social media to speak to detectives. Detectives spoke with Reyes at her place of employment.

Reyes stated she had stopped at the Arco AM/PM at the intersection of Charleston Boulevard and Eastern Avenue. She was near the vacuums located next to the car wash and heard three "pops." Since it was July, she initially believed the sound to be fireworks. When she looked up she observed a black SUV with chrome rims, traveling westbound on Charleston Boulevard in the eastbound lanes.

The vehicle turned north (right) onto Eastern Avenue. At that time, the passenger (Miranda) leaned out of the window and shot at the officers who had followed them. Reyes stated Miranda had turned around and faced the officers. She believed he was attempting to shoot the officers because "he was pointing directly at the one right behind him." Reyes did not believe the officers fired back at the vehicle.

The patrons at the Arco AM/PM panicked and yelled. Reyes was not sure what to do, but she remained by her vehicle as others ran. She did check to make sure she had not been shot. When no officers responded to the scene, Reyes left for work.

Suspect

Rene Nunez

On July 12, 2018, at approximately 1527 hours, Detective Penny conducted an audio recorded interview with Rene Nunez at UMC, room 208, bed 2. Also present for the interview were Detectives Leavitt and Sowers. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Nunez was in custody at UMC when detectives contacted him. Detective Penny explained why detectives were there and asked Nunez if he was willing to speak to them, which he replied, "Yes." Detective Penny then read Nunez his Miranda rights, to which Nunez stated he understood.

Nunez stated on July 11, 2018, he was with Tommy (Thomas) Romero and they were going to pick up a Sheriff's card for Romero. At approximately 0630 hours, when business started to open, Nunez and Romero headed in that direction, but decided to go to the car wash first because Nunez' vehicle (a stolen Ford Expedition) was "hella dirty." Nunez stated while at the car wash he was on one end of the wash bay and Romero was at the other putting money in the machine when he observed "Cabasone" (Fidel Miranda), their "ex-friend," walk up to them. Nunez then told detectives, "I seen fuckin' Cabasone reach into his shit and just - I heard bang, bang, bang, bang and I just seen Tommy fall. I was like, 'Fuck,' and I went around the back of the truck and I looked and I was like, 'What the fuck did you do?' And he goes, 'Get the fuck in the truck or I'm a fuckin' smoke your ass too.' I said, 'Oh hell nah, fool. What the fuck did you do?' and I was like, you know, trying to calm down. I was like, you know - and he was pointing the gun at me too on the other side of the car wash in the back of the car. He was just pointing the gun at me too, so I was, ah, fuck, so I just I walk - walked to the door and I jumped in, and I was like, fuck, what should I do? What should I do?"

Nunez stated Miranda looked "fucked up" and they had heard rumors he had been awake for seven days "tweakin'." Nunez said prior to Miranda getting into the truck he (Miranda) asked him where the gun Tommy carried was, and Nunez told Miranda he didn't know. Miranda then turned, went over to Tommy, and grabbed the gun he had on him. Nunez and Miranda then drove toward Boulder City because that is where Miranda wanted to go. According to Nunez, Miranda was going to go through Arizona to get to Mexico. Nunez stated Miranda threatened him and took his wallet when he got into the truck, but Nunez was able to hide his cell phone under his right leg. Nunez stated while they drove he tried to dial 911, but Miranda saw him, grabbed the cell phone, and saw that he had dialed 911. Nunez said he knew the call connected when Miranda screamed into the phone before disconnecting the call.

Detective Penny asked Nunez what his phone number was, but Nunez was unable to provide that information because he said he did not know it. He said the provider information was under the name Debbie or Deborah Bellhouse or Toolhouse. Detective Penny then asked Nunez how

he knew the call connected, and Nunez stated, "'Cause I heard a voice." Nunez further explained, "You know, that's when I started lookin' around all fuckin' nervous, tryin' to turn up the stereo, 'cause he was like, 'Where's your cell phone at?' And I'm, like, uh - you know, I looked down and the fucker just reached over and grabbed my shit. I was like, fuck, you know, 'cause he knows - he knows what I do, you know?"

Nunez stated he had known Miranda for a while, he (Miranda) sold weed and dope, and was known to "jack people." Nunez stated he was worried the whole time about somebody trying to stop them because the vehicle didn't have plates on it. He said Miranda removed the plates at the car wash.

Nunez and Miranda drove to Boulder City where they stopped at a convenience store to get a drink, then they headed back to Las Vegas to get Miranda's Cadillac. As they headed to the location of the Cadillac, which was near the car wash, an officer spotted them. Nunez gave the following account of what transpired at that point: "So when he seen me, like, tryin' to turn he was like, 'Don't you fuckin' dare, fool. I'm gonna smoke your ass if you do it. I'm a smoke your ass.' I was like, 'Fool, like, he's not gonna follow us, don't worry man. Just chill, just kick back,' 'cause he's already fuckin' lifting his shit, you know what I'm saying? I'm, like, 'Just chill, bro. Just chill. Nothing is gonna happen. Just kick back, fool. He's not gonna follow us.' He's like, 'You better not fuckin' turn, dog. You better not fuckin' turn.' And, like, to pu- I got in the turning lane and that's when he - he went like that and he started fuckin' looking back, he started looking back. That's when the truck turned around. The police truck. So he told me, 'Bust a bitch and step on it.' So I turned around and I'm going slow, and he's like, 'Don't go, don't go, don't go.' He's like, 'Wait. Wait till he turns. Wait till he turns.' And that's when we seen the police truck turning, and he's like, 'Step on it, motherfucker. Step on it.' And that's when I just stepped on it. Shit, he's like, 'Don't hit anything, don't hit anything.' He's like, 'Stay driving or I'm a fuckin' shoot your ass,' and that's when he started shooting and shit, and I guess he started shooting either back at you guys or back at me 'cause I seen him fuckin' - I seen him shooting at the air, and then I seen just start shooting at you guys.

Nunez said Miranda had four total guns with him: a .45 caliber Glock, a 9MM Smith & Wesson, a black and silver Taurus, and the gun he had taken off Romero. Nunez said while he was driving and being pursued by the police, one of the officers used a police vehicle to attempt to ram their vehicle. Nunez swerved and believed he ran over a median, which he thought popped all of the vehicle tires. Nunez stated he felt relieved at that time because then he could pull over. Nunez stated Miranda was pointing a gun at him and told him to keep driving. Nunez told detectives he plead with Miranda, saying, "Please let me get out." According to Nunez, Miranda said, "If you fuckin' get out I'm a fuckin' put one in your head." At that point, according to Nunez, that is when Miranda lifted the gun, and Nunez heard shots come from the truck behind them.

The officer in the vehicle behind Nunez and Miranda fired at them, and Nunez remembered all of the windows breaking out of their vehicle. Nunez then stopped the vehicle, pushed the door open, saw Miranda pointing the silver and black gun at him, and then he heard the gunshot. Nunez felt his ear ringing, and something warm running down his cheek and side as he ran. He said he got to the top of the stairs where he yelled for help, but the officers all pointed guns at him, so he laid down there. He said he had nothing on him because Miranda had taken his wallet and phone.

Detectives questioned Nunez on his version of the events for clarification and inconsistencies. Nunez was asked about the license plates being removed from the Ford Expedition and when that occurred. He stated it happened at the car wash after Romero had been shot; Miranda removed the front plate, and made him remove the rear plate. Nunez explained Miranda had given him the Ford Expedition two or three weeks prior to the incident. Nunez was informed by detectives they knew that vehicle was stolen. Nunez then admitted he knew it was stolen, and that he had gotten it from a "black dude." Nunez stated he was with a friend from high school, and while the friend was inside of a convenience store, he left with the Expedition and drove to Miranda's house. Miranda found a Taurus firearm concealed inside of a hidden compartment meant for a DVD player. Since the Ford Expedition was stolen, Nunez stated Miranda took license plates off a different vehicle, located around the corner from his house, which looked identical to the stolen Ford Expedition.

Nunez was asked if he had a firearm on him at the time of the incident, to which he said he did not. He said Romero was carrying a gun because he had a beef with Miranda. Romero was selling to Miranda's customers, which caused the dispute. Nunez stated Romero gave him the Taurus firearm to carry for protection; however, he did not want to carry it and had left it in the center console of the Expedition. When Nunez and Romero were at the car wash the gun was inside the vehicle. When Miranda got inside of the vehicle he found the Taurus in the center console. Detectives continued to question Nunez about the gun, and he stated he did touch one of the guns. Nunez was asked if he ever pointed a gun at any of the officers during the pursuit, to which he replied, "Hell no. No way." During the pursuit, after Miranda fired the Smith & Wesson until it was empty of rounds, Miranda threw the firearm toward Nunez and it landed on him. Nunez said the gun was hot, so he threw it off of him. According to Nunez, that was the only time he ever touched one of the firearms.

Detectives asked Nunez if he was a convicted felon, and Nunez replied, "Yeah." He was asked if he is supposed to have any guns, to which he replied he was not. Nunez stated he told Romero he wasn't supposed to have any guns, and that is why he kept it in the center console. Romero had given Nunez a holster for the gun, which Nunez claimed he wore without a firearm in it. When detectives informed Nunez of video surveillance that showed him pull the Taurus from the holster as Romero had been shot, Nunez stated, "Now I remember that - that I couldn't fuckin' shoot 'cause of the safety. It has a little safety thing on the little - the hole." Nunez explained he lied about having a gun in the holster because he did not want to get in trouble for being an ex-felon in possession of a firearm.

Nunez stated when Miranda first entered the vehicle at the car wash, after he took Romero's gun, he threw the gun toward center console. The gun missed the center console area and slid toward him Nunez. Nunez reached for the gun and Miranda said, "Don't fuckin' think about it." Since Miranda told Nunez not to pick up the gun, Nunez let it fall to the floor, and it eventually slid to the back seat of the vehicle.

Nunez stated from the moment he and Miranda got into the Ford Expedition at the car wash, until the police stopped them, he was forced to drive the vehicle at gunpoint. He stated he knew Miranda had a beef with him because he was friends with Romero. When asked about his association with Miranda, Nunez said the following: "I haven't that contact with that fool for - for

the longest already. Like, I called the night before to let him know I don't want no issue, you know, just to stay away from me and I'm a stay away from him, 'cause we got into - we got into a heated argument, you know. He was talkin' about, 'Yeah, I'm a go shoot this bitch da-da-da-da-da.' I was like, 'Look fool, I don't wanna hear about none of that shit.' I was like, 'If anything, leave me the fuck alone.' I was like, 'You in all that shit you be doing is bullshit, dog.' Like, he be stayin' up and trippin'."

Nunez was asked to clarify about being shot by Miranda. He stated that Miranda pointed the gun at his head and said, "Don't fuckin' stop." That is when Nunez opened the door and Miranda shot him. Nunez stated he was looking straight at Miranda, and heard the bang as he turned to face away from him. Detectives questioned Nunez about the wallet and cell phone he stated Miranda had taken from him because when Nunez was taken into custody he had both items in his possession. Detective Penny asked Nunez, "So as you're driving in a high speed pursuit, bullets flyin' back and forth, um, you reach down on the floor, grab your wallet?" Nunez replied, "No - no - no - no. As we stopped, after he popped my ass, and turned around to shoot back at you guys, the wallet was on the floor. 'Cause like you said, if we wrecked or crashed, I'm not sure how it happened, we got to a stop 'cause the car - the car didn't have no more tire, you get me? It stopped rollin', so I reached down on the floor after he popped my ass, I grabbed my shit, and I started running. 'Cause I seen my shit right there, like, literally right there under the seat, so I grabbed it and I started running up the stairs."
