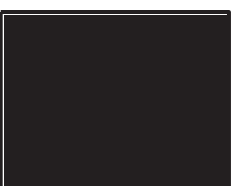

III. INCIDENT DETAILS

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 0741 hours, Officer N. Paul Bruning conducted a traffic stop at 18th Street and Sunrise Avenue on an unregistered blue Infinity driven by Demontry Boyd. During the stop, Officer Bruning asked the dispatcher for another officer to respond to his location. Shortly after requesting another officer, Officer Bruning advised he had deployed his Taser. Officer Bruning then advised shots had been fired, and requested medical personnel respond to the scene to care for Boyd.

Following the briefing Detective Alsup was assigned as the lead case agent and tasked with the responsibility of documenting the crime scene with crime scene analysts. Detectives Leavitt, Melton, Mendoza, and Penny were assigned to interview available witnesses. Detective Patton was assigned responsibilities at the hospital, which included interviewing any possible witnesses and conduct weapon count downs.

IV. BODY WORN CAMERAS

Officer Bruning was wearing a body worn camera (BWC) at the time of the incident and the camera was activated. The camera was collected by Detective Joseph Patton and secured. The video footage captured was later viewed by Officer Bruning at 1134 hours on December 1, 2018, in the presence of Sergeant Jerry MacDonald, LVPPA representative Bryan Yant, and LVPPA attorney John Aldrich.

Officer Bruning's camera footage depicted the following:

Officer Bruning conducted a vehicle stop on an unlicensed blue Infinity sport utility vehicle (SUV). Officer Bruning made contact with the driver, Demonty Boyd, and asked him to step out of the vehicle. Officer Bruning attempted to arrest Boyd and a physical altercation ensued. Officer Bruning discharged his taser and firearm.

V. HOSPITAL

Location and Description of the Body

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 0955 hours, Detective Patton responded to UMC Trauma Center. Upon Detective Patton's arrival, he met with Detective Thomas Riesselmann, P# 3956, Officer Alberto Guzman, P# 16876, and Senior CSA (SCSA) Brenda Vaandering, P# 13575, at the Negative Pressure Isolation Room.

SCSA Vaandering responded to UMC Trauma Center to photograph and document the body of Demonty Boyd, and photograph and collect evidence. The following are some of the photographs taken by SCSA Vaandering of Boyd's injuries. For additional details, refer to

VI. SCENE WALK-THROUGHS

The purpose of the scene walk-through was to help investigators develop an understanding of the scene, including identifying officer location(s) at the time deadly force was used, identifying potential physical evidence, and re-creating a timeline of the incident.

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 1145 hours, Officer Bruning provided a walk-through of the scene in the presence of the following persons:

During the walk-through, which was not video or audio recorded, Officer Bruning relayed the following information:

He stated he had been fighting with Boyd and discharged his Taser. During the struggle with Boyd, the wires from the Taser had wrapped around Officer Bruning's arms and boots. As the Taser was cycled, Officer Bruning felt the shock of the Taser.

At some point the Taser fell to the ground. Officer Bruning stated to Boyd, "Don't you dare," as Boyd picked up the Taser. Officer Bruning was in fear for his life and discharged his firearm two times.

Officer Bruning was asked about an item on the ground which when viewed on BWC appeared to have been attached to Boyd's hip. Officer Bruning stated he observed the object during the incident and believed it was either a holster for a firearm or a sheathed knife.

Officer Bruning placed orange traffic cones where he believed he and Boyd were standing at the time he discharged his firearm.

VII. PUBLIC SAFETY STATEMENT

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 0953 hours, Detective Mendoza interviewed Sergeant James McGuire in reference to the Public Safety Statement he obtained from Officer Bruning. Also present during the interview was LVPMSA representative Michelle Jotz. Below is the transcript of the interview.

Note: Detective Mendoza is designated by (SM) and Sergeant McGuire is designated by (JM). LVPMSA Michelle Jotz is designated by (MJ).

SM: All right. Operator, this is Detective S. Mendoza, with the Force Investigation Deam...Team, conducting a tt...a recorded Public Safety Statement interview with Sergeant James McGuire, uh, P# 14067. Uh, his call sign was 784. Date of hire 06-18-2009. Works out of Downtown Area Command, squad DT24. Uh, RDOs are Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. Hours of 0630 to 1630. Also present is LVPMSA, uh, representative Michelle Jotz, Sergeant Michelle Jotz, uh, P# 4964. This Public Safety Statement is in reference to an officer-involved shooting that occurred on December firth...1st 2018, at approximately 0745 hours, in the area of Sunrise Avenue and 18th Street, Las Vegas, NV 89101, uh, reference Event# 181200001160. Today's date is December 1, 2018. Time of 0953 hours. Uh, this statement is being conducted, uh, south of the intersection of Bruce and Fremont Street in LVMPD vehicle...unmarked vehicle 4363. All right. Sergeant McGuire, uh, you conducted the Public Safety Statement with the involved officer, correct?

JM: Yes.

SM: And what officer was that? What was his name?

JM: Uh, first initial N-Nora, last name Bruning, spelled Baker-Robert-Union-Nora-Nora-George.

SM: Okay. Um, and during that Public Safety Statement you asked him a series of questions?

JM: Yes.

SM: Okay. So, uh, we'll go onto the, uh, the question that you asked him, then you can just go ahead and read do your, uh...

JM: Okay.

SM: ...your answers.

- JM: Uh, question 1: "Did you discharge your firearm?" The officer stated, "Yeah."
- Question 1A: "If so, in what direction?" Officer stated, "Twice that way." He then pointed north.
- Question 1B: "Approximately where were you located when you fired?" Officer stated, "Right where he's laying."
- Question 1C: "How many shots do you think you fired?" Officer stated, "Two."
- Question 2: "Is anyone injured?" Officer stated, "Just the suspect laying over there."
- Question 2A: "If so, where are they located?" Officer stated, "By the blue car."
- Question 3: "Are there any outstanding suspects?" Officer stated, "No."
- Question 3A, B, C, D, and E were not applicable.
- Question 4: "Is it possible the suspect fired rounds at you?" Officer stated, "No."
- Question 4A, B, and C not applicable.
- Question 5: "Do you know if any other officers discharged their firearms?" Officer stated, "They did not."
- Question 5A and B were not applicable.
- Question 6: "Are there any weapons or evidence that need to be secured/protected?" Officer stated, "No."
- Question 6A was not applicable.
- Question 7: "Are you aware of any witnesses?" Officer stated, "These people over there."
- Question 7A: "If so, what is their location?" He pointed to the apartments on Fremont. I believe it's 1840 Fremont. Officer then stated, "Possibly vagrants by the old gas pumps."
- SM: Okay. And, uh, the only PS...Public Safety Statement you did was with the...that officer?
- JM: Correct.
- SM: Correct? Okay. Um, Sergeant Jotz, do you have anything?
- MJ: I have nothing.
- SM: Okay. All right. That'll conclude the, uh, Public Safety Statement with, uh, Sergeant McGuire. Time is 0956 hours.

VIII. OFFICER WEAPON COUNTDOWNS

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 1215 hours, Officer Bruning had his duty weapon counted down at LVMPD headquarters. Officer Bruning was photographed by CSI personnel for appearance purposes and his weapon was photographed for identification purposes.

The following persons were present during the countdown:

Officer Bruning was dressed in a standard tan LVMPD long sleeve uniform and a green LVMPD jacket. He wore LVMPD patches on each shoulder and an LVMPD badge over his left breast. Officer Bruning wore a black duty belt with attached tools and equipment as part of his position as an officer assigned to the Traffic Bureau. Officer Bruning's handgun was carried on the right side of his body and secured in a holster. Officer Bruning's jacket had a large tear along the right side. There was a long tear on the inside of his left pant leg, and the button from his left shirt sleeve was missing.

Prior to countdown Officer Bruning stated he carried 14 cartridges in the magazine loaded in his firearm and one cartridge in the chamber (14+1, 15 total).

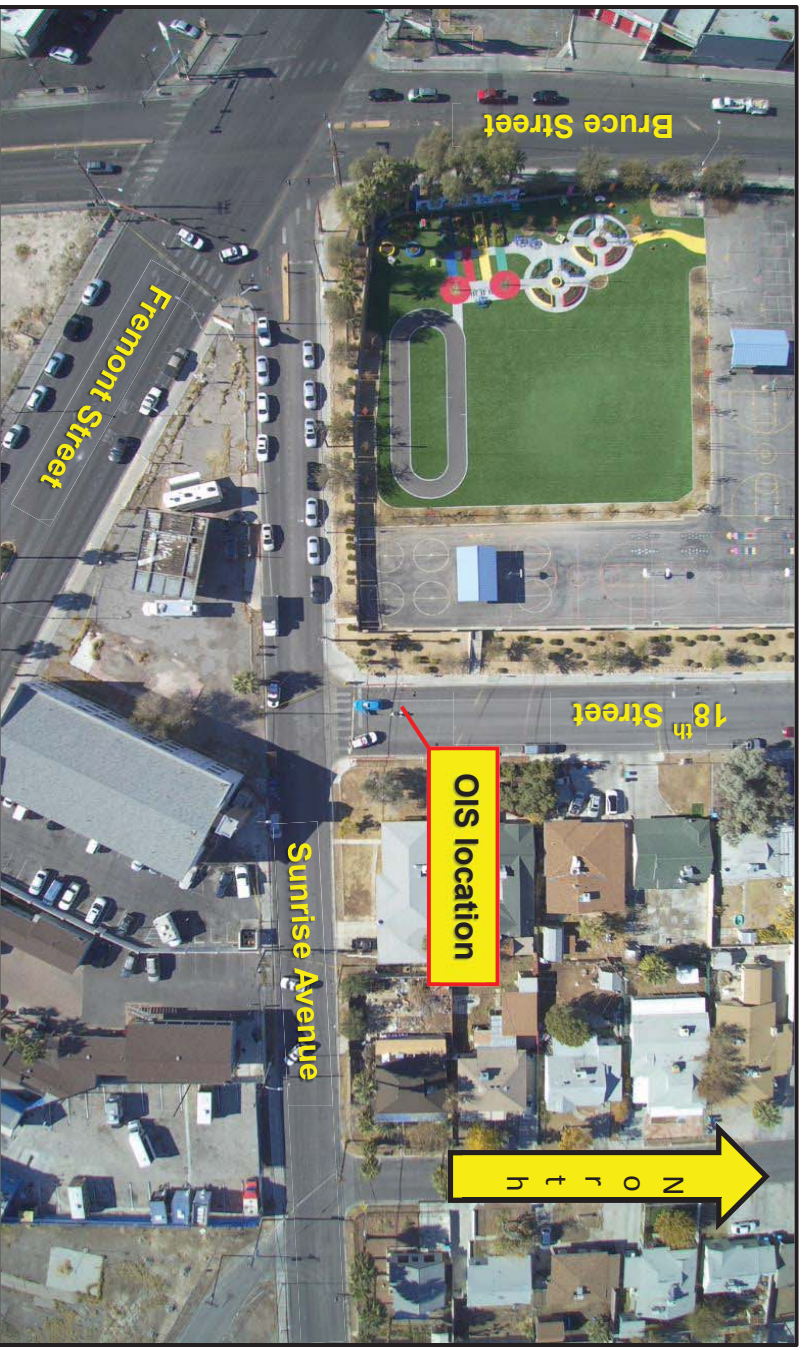

When compared to evidence at the scene, detectives concluded Officer Bruning discharged his firearm two times. Officer Bruning's firearm, magazine, and cartridges were photographed and impounded by SCSA Vaandering.

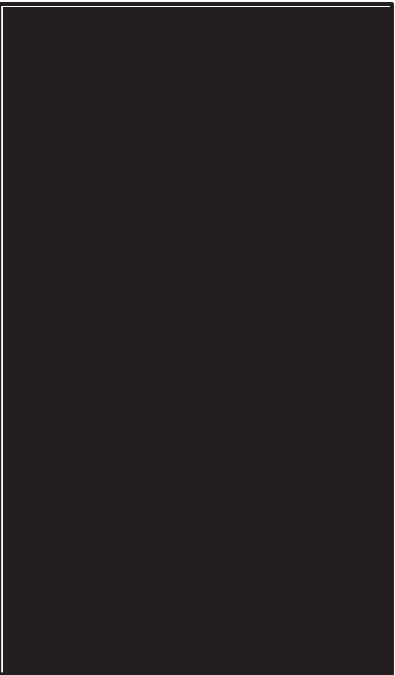

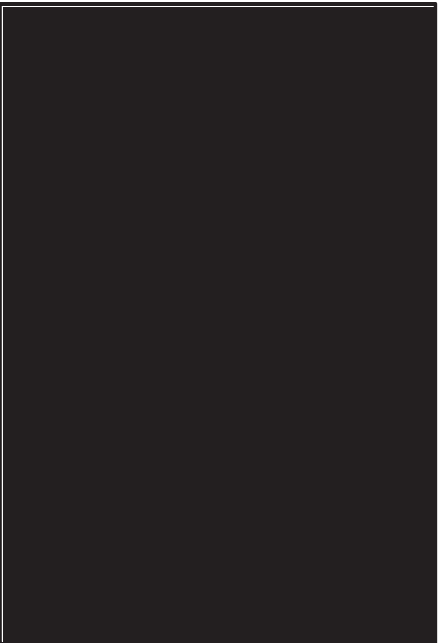
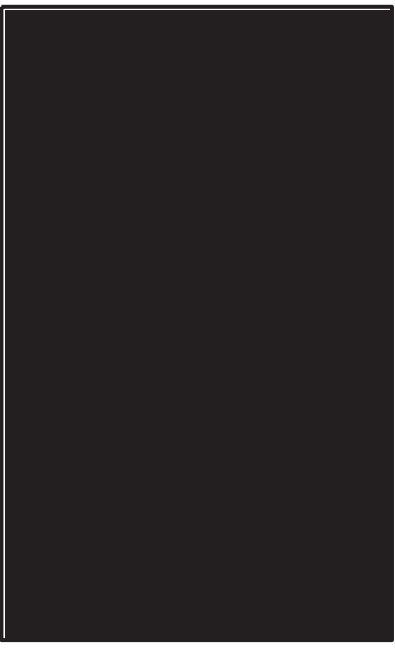
Above: Aerial views of the OIS scene.

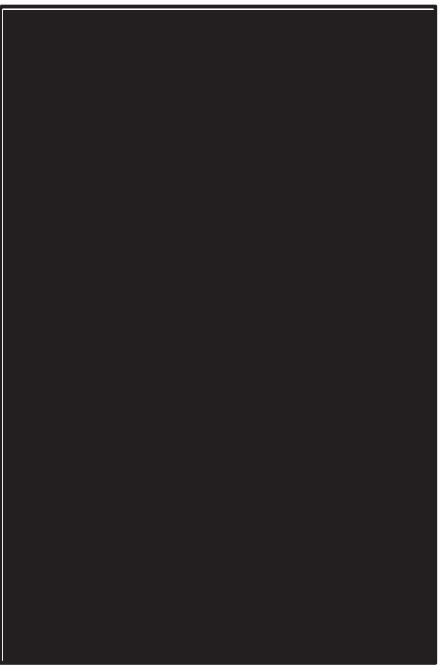

X. THIRD PARTY VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHIC EVIDENCE

104 N. 18th Street, Las Vegas, NV 89101

Home surveillance video footage was obtained from a camera mounted on the exterior of the residence at 104 N. 18th Street. The camera captured a blue Infinity SUV travelling southbound on 18th Street, followed by Officer Bruning on his police motorcycle. The vehicles stop in an area where the view from the camera was obstructed by a tree in the front yard.

Officer Bruning's Taser was observed bouncing and sliding across the asphalt approximately three minutes after the vehicles stopped. Officer Bruning was then observed walking backwards as Boyd walked towards him. Boyd knelt down and attempted to pick up the Taser. Officer Bruning stepped on the Taser, but Boyd was able to gain control of it. Boyd stood up with the Taser, but appeared to drop it.

Boyd and Officer Bruning remained in close proximity and appeared to be grabbing onto each other. Officer Bruning appeared to reach for his firearm, and Boyd attempted to strike Officer Bruning several times with his hands. Boyd fell to the ground, and the view of him was partially obscured by a tree in the front yard. Officer Bruning moved out of camera view. Another officer then approached Boyd and appeared to place him in handcuffs.

XI. AUTOPSY

On December 2, 2018, at approximately 1000 hours, under Clark County Officer of the Coroner/Medical Examiner (CCOCME) case 18-12139, an autopsy was performed on the body of Demontry Boyd at the CCOCME by Doctor Chiara Mancini.

- 7) One cut white "Hanes" tank top style shirt with apparent blood and hole defects, size L, from Boyd's upper body
- 8) One black skull cap with a hole defect from Boyd's head
- 9) One cut pair of blue "Polo Ralph Lauren" boxer briefs with apparent blood, Size L, from Boyd's lower body
- 10) One Taser probe with apparent blood
- 11) One Taser probe with wire attached and apparent blood
- 12) One bullet

The following wounds/injuries were noted on Demonty Boyd:

- 1) Penetrating gunshot wound of central chest
- 2) Perforating gunshot wound of right chest
- 3) Puncture wound on the right side of the abdomen (limited to skin and subcutaneous soft tissues) related to conducted electrical weapon
- 4) Multiple red linear and irregularly-shaped abrasions on the scalp, face, posterior left ear, bilateral upper extremities (particularly the posterior forearms and hands), and right lower extremity

Upon the completion of toxicology testing, the following results were noted:



After a complete autopsy, Doctor Mancini opined Boyd died as a result of multiple gunshot wounds. The manner of death was homicide.

Involved Officer

Officer N. Paul Bruning

Per LVMPD Policy 6/002.04, Post Use of Force Procedures, an involved officer may provide a recorded statement to FIT investigators. If given, involved officer statements are taken at least 48 hours after the incident unless waived by the involved officer.

On December 2, 2018, at approximately 0910 hours, Sergeant MacDonald contacted LVPPA representative Bryan Yant to see if Officer Bruning would provide a voluntary statement to FIT investigators; Officer Bruning declined.

Witnesses

Officer Manuel Papazian

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 0953 hours, Detective Penny conducted an audio recorded interview with Officer Papazian inside LVMPD vehicle 19430, which was parked in the area of 1740 Fremont Street. Also present for the interview was Detective Melton, and LVPPA representative Brian Grammas. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

Officer Papazian was on duty when he heard a traffic unit (Officer Bruning) request another unit. Officer Papazian stated Officer Bruning's voice over the radio sounded stressed. Officer Papazian was driving towards the scene of the traffic stop when he heard Officer Bruning advise over the radio he had deployed his Taser.

Officer Papazian arrived and he saw Officer Bruning backing up while pointing what he thought to be a Taser at the suspect (Demontroy Boyd). Boyd was standing and facing Officer Bruning, and appeared to be getting ready to lunge at him when Boyd looked over and saw Officer Papazian. Boyd then laid on the ground in the prone position.

Officer Papazian believed Boyd was being tased and ran towards him with the intent of handcuffing Boyd during the cycle of the ECD. Officer Papazian handcuffed Boyd, rolled him to his side, and noticed a pool of blood. Officer Papazian asked Officer Bruning if Boyd was shot and was told yes. Medical personnel were requested to the scene.

Officer Papazian was securing the scene when he saw Officer Bruning's Taser on the street. Officer Papazian then realized Officer Bruning was holding his firearm while he was retreating away from Boyd and not a Taser as Officer Papazian first believed.

Namon Taylor

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 1209 hours, Detective Mendoza conducted an audio recorded interview with Namon Taylor at Taylor's apartment located at 1841 E. Fremont Street, #21. Also present for the interview was Detective Melton. Below is a summary of the interview; for complete details refer to the interview transcript.

On December 1, 2018, at approximately 0735 hours, Taylor was inside his apartment when he heard through his window what he described as a "commotion." Taylor's window faced westbound and overlooked a vacant lot, and beyond the lot was the intersection of Sunrise Avenue and 18st Street where the OIS occurred. Several moments later, Taylor exited his apartment building and was walking westbound on the north side of Fremont Street toward the 7-Eleven located at 1740 E. Fremont Street. Taylor then looked in a northbound direction, past the vacant lot and toward the intersection of Sunrise Avenue and 18st Street. Taylor observed a blue vehicle, along with a police officer (Officer Bruning) and a black male adult wearing dark clothing (Demontroy Boyd) involved in a confrontation. Taylor described Boyd as looking "kinda homeless" and a "dirty dude" who did not fit the nice car he was driving.

Taylor observed Boyd lunge at Officer Bruning at least three different times, and Officer Bruning pushed Boyd down each time and yelled, "No!" Taylor stated Officer Bruning looked scared, and was becoming tired after having pushed Boyd away multiple times. Taylor believed at one point Boyd yelled, "Shoot me!" to Officer Bruning. Taylor believed Boyd was attempting to reach for Officer Bruning's firearm because Officer Bruning was covering his firearm with both hands while yelling at Boyd. Taylor then heard one gunshot, followed shortly thereafter by another gunshot. Taylor said the majority of the incident took place behind the blue car Boyd was driving.
