Section: CRIME INDICATORS	Data Source: P1 Case Reports Data Warehouse	Date Field: Reported On Date
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Purpose: To provide statistics for key metrics associated with violent crime. These statistics are based on when crimes were made known to the department and where criminal activity occurred.

Method: The statistics in the “Crime Indicators” section are derived from all offenses, not just those listed in the “Crime Categories” section. For area-command specific statistics, indicators are grouped based on their geographic location within a particular area command, regardless of who submitted the report. This means that the statistics for each area command reflect the total number of crimes that occurred within that area, regardless of the reporting group.

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Section: **ARREST CATEGORIES**

Data Source: **P1 Case Reports Data Warehouse**

Date Field: **Arrested On Date**

Purpose: To provide statistics for arrest activity based on the arrest location and when the booking occurred.

Method: Arrest statistics are one count per unique arrestee per unique IBR crime committed. In other words, if one individual was charged with three separate IBR codes, that individual is counted three times. Arrest statistics have no direct relation to or correlation with the "Crime Categories" section of the report. Arrests made could be related to crimes committed outside the specified data range since they use the date the arrest was made on instead of the date the crime was reported on. Arrest statistics only include the "Taken Into Custody" arrest type, and not "Summoned/Cited". For area-command specific statistics, arrests are grouped based on the geographic location of the arrest within a particular area command as indicated by the "Arrest Location" field in the P1 Case Report under the Arrestees tab. This geographic location is irrespective of who submitted the report, which means that the statistics for each area command reflect the total number of arrests that occurred within that area, regardless of the reporting group or arresting group.

Section: **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

Data Source: **P1 CAD / P1 Case Reports Data Warehouse**

Date Field: **Incident Date**

Purpose: To provide statistics for calls for service and officer-initiated activities based on the date of the incident and where the incident occurred.

Method: For area-command specific statistics, incidents and field interviews are grouped based on their geographic location within a particular area command, regardless of who the primary officer of a given event was, who was responsible for any issued citations, or who was responsible for any field interviews conducted. This means that the statistics for each area command reflect the total number of incidents that occurred within that area, regardless of the officer(s) involved.

<p>401 – 447: One count for every event number closed with an incident type (400 Code) of 401 through 447.</p> <p>CFS CITATIONS: One count for every event number closed as a 401 through 447 incident type and with a citation issued (closed with a disposition of B or E).</p>	<p>467: One count for every event number closed with an incident type of 467.</p> <p>468: One count for every event number closed with an incident type of 468.</p> <p>469: One count for every event number closed with an incident type of 469.</p> <p>OFFICER INITIATED CITATIONS: One count for every event number closed as with an incident type of a 467, 468, or 469 and with a citation issued (closed with a disposition of B or E).</p> <p>FIELD INTERVIEWS: – One count for every field interview documented through P1 RMS.</p>

Section: TRAFFIC FATALITIES	Data Source: CAG Traffic Fatality Log	Date Field: Date of Collision
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Purpose: Provide traffic fatality statistics based on where accidents took place and when the collision occurred.

Method: Traffic Fatality statistics are manually maintained by the Crime Analysis Group. Counts shown are aggregated based on number of incidents that occur geographically in a specific Area Command for the specified date range. Only fatalities where the date of death occurred within 30 days of the date of collision are included.
