

Sands Stock Purchased For \$67,000

CARSON CITY (AP) — An application by Harrah's Club to expand its operations in downtown Reno next door into the former Golden Casino was recommended for approval Thursday by the Nevada Gaming Control Board

HARRAH'S seeks permission to operate 24 table games and 450 slot machines while leasing the casino, theater and restaurant from James and William Tomerlin. The Golden closed earlier this year.

The control board already has given the club tentative approval to go ahead with its plans to open the extension June 20 — its twentieth anniversary in Reno.

WILLIAM Harrah is the largest single casino stockholder in Nevada. No financial details on the transaction were disclosed.

Michael Winchinsky of Las

MICHAEL WURTHUSKY of Las Vegas was recommended for approval to buy an additional 1.5 per cent stock in the Sands Hotel of Las Vegas for \$67,285. He would buy the shares from the corporate treasury.

THE NEVADA Gaming Commission meets June 21 in Carson City to make final decisions on this month's agenda.

Major applications taken under study include bids by six men to invest a reported \$225,000 and loan \$750,000 to Caesars Palace Hotel Casino on the Las Vegas Strip. This represents more than six per cent of the corporate stock.

POTENTIAL investors in Caesars Palace are Selma Cook, a New York City housewife-financier; John Cohen, a Boston real estate investor; Jud McIntosh, an Atlanta financier and business consultant, and Marvin Krause, George Deverell and William Klim, all Las Vegas gamblers.
